**4. Title** Schoolsafety personnel.

**5. Summary/Purpose:** The introduced legislation proposes to amend and reenact the second enactment of Chapter 836 and the second enactment of Chapter 868 of the Acts of Assembly of 2002 to delay for one year, until September 15, 2004, the date upon which training and employment standards for persons employed as school security officers will be applicable. These standards were to be developed by the Department of Criminal Justice Services, in consultation with the Department of Education and the Virginia State Crime Commission, pursuant to HB498 and SB295 (Chapters 868 and 836 of the Acts of Assembly of 2002, respectively).

**8. Fiscal implications:** The Department of Criminal Justice Services advises that this legislation will impact the agency only in the sense that it provides it additional time to develop the training and employment standards for school safety officers.
