Summary/Purpose: The bill would require the State Water Control Board, in consultation with the State Health Commissioner, local governments, public service authorities, and other interested parties, to establish a comprehensive water supply planning process for the development of local, regional and state water supply plans. The planning process must (i) ensure that a dequate and safed rinking water is available to all citizens of the Common wealth, (ii) encourage, promote, and protect all other beneficial uses of the Common wealth's water resources, and (iii) encourage, promote, and evelopin centives for alternative water sources, including but not limited to desalinization.

TheStateWaterControlBoardistopromulgateregulationsnecessarytocarryoutthe provisionsofthisbill,includingcriteriaforthedevelopmentoflocalan dregionalwater supplyplans.SuchregulationsmaynotbecomeeffectivepriortoJuly1,2004.TheBoardis topreparedraftcriteriaforthedevelopmentofthelocalandregionalwatersupplyplansanda preliminarystatewaterresourcesplanbyDecemb er1,2003.Thepreliminaryplanisto includeinformationfromexistinglocalandregionalwatersupplyplans.Thebillwouldalso requiretheWaterPolicyTechnicalAdvisoryCommitteetoworkwiththeDepartmentof EnvironmentalQualityandtheDepartm entofHealthonthedevelopmentoftheplan,criteria, guidelinesandregulationsandtoadvisetheseagenciesonanyfurtherchangesneededtothe Commonwealth'swaterresourcespoliciesandprograms

Fiscalimplications: TheDepartmentofEnvironmentalQuality'sFY2004budgetincludes anadditional\$850,000to developastatewidewatersupplyplanninginitiative and tosponsor groundwaterresearch.Ofthatamount,theDepartmentofEnvironmentalQualityestimates that\$621,088willbeneededtoestablishacomprehensivewatersupplyplanningprocessfor thedevelopmentoflocal,regionalandstatewatersupplyplans. Theremainingfunds (\$228,912)willbeusedtoinstalladditionalwatergaugesandtodeveloptheUnitedStates GeologicalSurvey/DepartmentofEnvironmentalQualityCoastalPlainModel.

Theagencyestimatesthatthisfunding(\$850,000),ifitismainta inedpermanentlyinits budget,wouldbesufficienttoimplementtheprovisionsofthisbill. Theagencyestimates, however, that it would need an additional 10 positions (general fund) to implement these provisions. There would be no fiscal impact to the Department of Health associated with this bill.
