The planning process must (i) ensurethatadequateandsafedrinkingwaterisavailabletoallcitizensoftheCommonwealth, (ii)encourage,promote,andprotectallotherbeneficialusesoftheCommonwealth'swater resources, and (ii i) encourage, promote, and developing entives for alternative water sources. TheBoardistopreparedraftcriteriaforthedevelopmentofthelocalandregionalwater supplyplansandapreliminarystatewaterresourcesplanbyDecember1,2003.The preliminary planisto include information from existing local and regional water supply plans. 8. Fiscalimplications: The Department of Environmental Quality's FY2004 budget includes an additional \$850,000 to develop a statewide water supply planning initiative and to sponsor ground water research. Of that amount, the Department of Environmental Quality estimates that \$621,088 will be needed to establish a comprehensive water supply planning process for the development of local, regional and statewater supply plans. The remaining funds (\$228,912) will be used to install additional water gauges and to develop the United States Geological Survey/Department of Environmental Quality Coast al Plain Model.

Theagencyestimatesthatthisfunding (\$850,000), if it is maintained permanently in its budget, would be sufficient to implement the provisions of this bill. The agency estimates, however, that it would need an additional 10 positions (general fund) to implement these provisions. There would be no fiscal impact to the Department of Health associated with this bill.
