3	A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 23-296 and 23-297 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Frontier
4	Culture Museum of Virginia.
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	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That §§ 23-296 and 23-297 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 23-296. Frontier Culture Museum of Virginia created; purpose.
12	There is hereby created and constituted an educational institution of the Commonwealth to be known
13	as the "Frontier Culture Museum of Virginia as a state agency," hereinafter referred to as the
14	"Museum." The purpose of the museum is to construct, operate, and maintain, in the Augusta
15	County/Staunton/Waynesboro area Augusta County, Staunton, and Waynesboro areas of the
16	Commonwealth, an outdoor museum in order to commemorate on an international scale the contribution
17	which that the pioneers and colonial frontiersmen and frontierswomen of the eighteenth and nineteenth
18	centuries made to the creation and development of the United States. The Museum is an educational
19	institution with responsibility to shall administer certain historical and interpretive programs as may be
20	established.
21	§ 23-297. Board of Trustees; membership; terms; officers and committees; compensation.
22	A. The Frontier Culture Museum of Virginia shall be administered by a Board of Trustees consisting
23	of no more than twenty-five 13 members. The members shall that include six legislative members and
24	seven nonlegislative citizen members to be appointed as follows: five four members of the House of
25	Delegates shall to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, in accordance with the
26	principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; three two
27	members of the Senate shall to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; and
28	nine seven nonlegislative citizen members shall to be appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation
29	by the General Assembly.
30	B. Legislative members shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. Members appointed
31	by the Governor shall serve terms as follows: three members shall serve for one year, two members
32	shall serve for two years, two members shall serve for three years, and two members shall serve for four
33	years. Thereafter, members appointed shall serve for four-year terms. Appointments to fill vacancies,
34	other than by expiration of a term, shall be made for the unexpired term. The Governor may appoint,
35	upon recommendation of the Board of Trustees, eight additional members for four-year terms who may
36	be nonresidents of the Commonwealth and who shall serve at no expense to the Commonwealth. terms.
37	All members may be reappointed. However, no House member shall serve more than four consecutive
38	two-year terms, no Senate member shall serve more than two consecutive four-year terms, and no
39	nonlegislative citizen member appointed by the Governor shall serve more than two consecutive
40	four-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill a vacancy shall not
41	constitute a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment. Vacancies shall be filled in
42	the same manner as the original appointments. Nonlegislative citizen members may be nonresidents of
43	the Commonwealth.
44	C. The Board of Trustees shall elect a chairman, vice chairman vice chairman, and such other
45	officers from among its membership as it deems necessary. A majority of the members shall constitute a
46	quorum. The Board of Trustees shall meet [ at least no more than ] four times each year. The meetings
47	of the Board shall be held at the call of the chairman or whenever the majority of the members so
<b>48</b>	request. Seven or more of the members of the Board of Trustees shall constitute an executive
49	committee.
50	D. The Legislative members of the Board of Trustees shall be reimbursed for actual expenses and
51	shall be compensated at the per diem rate established for members of the General Assembly for
52	meetings receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12, and shall be reimbursed for reasonable
53	and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and
54	2.2-2825. However, nonlegislative citizen members shall not be eligible to receive compensation or
55	reimbursement of expenses. Funding for the costs of compensation and expenses of the members shall be
56	provided by the Office of the Secretary of Education.
57	The Office of the Secretary of Education shall provide staff support to the Board of Trustees. All
58	agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Board of Trustees, upon request.

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59 The chairman of the Board of Trustees shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an

60 annual executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Museum no later than the first day of 61

each regular session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative 62

documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 63

2. That the current membership of the Board of Trustees shall continue to serve until their 64

respective terms expire. On July 1, 2004, the Board of Trustees shall consist of 13 members, of 65

whom seven shall be nonlegislative citizen members. 66
