A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.2-2667 and 2.2-2668 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Virginia Recycling Markets Development Council.

10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 2.2-2667 and 2.2-2668 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: 11 § 2.2-2667. The Virginia Recycling Markets Development Council; membership; meetings; staff. 12

A. The Virginia Recycling Markets Development Council (the "Council") is established as an 13 14 advisory council, within the meaning of § 2.2-2100, in the executive branch of state government. The 15 Council shall be composed of nineteen 20 members as follows: the Directors, or a policy-making 16 designee, of the Departments of Economic DevelopmentBusiness Assistance, Environmental Quality, General Services and Transportation, who shall serve ex officio with voting privileges; and fifteen 16 17 nonlegislative citizen members appointed by the Governor. The nonlegislative citizen members shall be 18 19 appointed from among residents of the Commonwealth who are knowledgeable about recycling and the 20 development of markets for recyclable materials. Of the fifteen citizen members, and shall be comprised 21 of: one member shall be a representative of representing county governments selected from appointed 22 following the consideration of nominations, if any, submitted by the Virginia Association of Counties; 23 one member representing municipal government selected from governments appointed following the 24 consideration of nominations, if any, submitted by the Virginia Municipal League; one member 25 representing urban Planning District Commissions and one member representing rural Planning District Commissions selected from appointed following the consideration of nominations, if any, submitted from 26 27 by the Association of Planning Districts; one member from the general public; and one representative 28 each, selected from appointed following the consideration of nominations, if any, submitted by 29 recognized industry associations representing solid waste collection and disposal, recycling, glass, paper, 30 aluminum, plastic, tire, oil, scrap metal, *electronics*, and organic waste.

B. Citizen members of the Council shall serve four-year terms. However, for the terms of the fifteen citizen members to be appointed July 1, 2001, eight shall be appointed for four-year terms and seven 32 33 shall be appointed for two-year terms. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for terms of four years, except that Directors and their policy designees shall serve terms coincident with the terms of office of the director. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired terms. All members may be 34 35 36 reappointed. However, no citizen member of the Council shall be eligible to serve more than two 37 consecutive four-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a citizen member is appointed to fill a 38 vacancy shall not constitute a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment. Vacancies 39 shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments.

40 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, citizen members of the Council shall not receive 41 expenses as defined in § 2.2-2813 and shall serve without compensation.

42 C. The Council shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman annually from among its members. The Council shall meet at least quarterly on such dates and at such times as they determine. A majority of 43 the appointed members of the Council shall constitute a quorum. 44 45

D. Staff support shall be provided by the members of the Council.

§ 2.2-2668. Powers and duties of Council. 46 47

A. The Council shall have the power and duty to:

1. Promote and coordinate state agencies' and authorities' efforts to enhanceUpon request, assist local 48 49 governments, regional authorities and agencies of the Commonwealth in meeting recycling mandates established under state law and identify markets for recycled or recovered materials collected or 50 51 generated by local governments, regional authorities or agencies of the Commonwealth: 52

2. Promote the purchase of products made from recycled or recovered material;

53 32. Identify and evaluate financial and other incentivesexisting or proposed state statutes, policies, regulations, and procedures that may attract or deter new businesses or the expansion or retention of 54 55 existing businesses that can use recycled or recovered materials generated in Virginia;

4. Identify the Commonwealth or that may create barriers to the development of markets for or the 56 57 reuse of recycled materials including existing state policies, regulations and procedures, and recommend 58 alternatives to overcome such obstacles;

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59 5. Develop recommendations for the establishment of a regional or interstate marketing system for 60 recycled materials;

61 6. Encourage the use of uniform recycling definitions and standards throughout the state;

62 7. Promote and encourage public/private market development initiatives;

63 8. Report annually its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly; and 9. Determine the volume of materials by varying categories or commodities that is being recycled in 64 the Commonwealth and to report its findings in its annual report. The Council shall investigate the 65 frequency of situations in which, because of market conditions or other factors, materials collected for 66 recycling are otherwise disposed of, and determine measures to avoid the recurrence of such situations. 67 The Department of Environmental Quality shall provide staff to the Council for the purposes of this **68** subdivision and shall cooperate with the Council in the preparation of the report. 69

B. The Council shall develop and monitor the implementation of a plan to strengthen Virginia's 70 recycling infrastructure and markets that will (i) improve the supply and quantity of recyclables 71 available; (ii) expand the capacity of collectors, processors and manufacturers to handle and use 72 secondary materials; and (iii) incorporate strategies to increase the use of specific materials.collected by 73 74 or on behalf of local governments and regional authorities;

75 3. Facilitate access to markets for recycled or recovered materials collected by local governments, 76 authorities, businesses, and residents of the Commonwealth; 77

4. Develop, update annually, and implement a plan to fulfill its powers and duties; and

78 5. Upon request of the Governor, resolution of the General Assembly, a standing or joint study 79 committee, the Secretary of Natural Resources, or the Department of Environmental Quality, report its findings and recommendations as directed. 80

2. That all current members of the Virginia Recycling Markets Development Council shall complete their current terms and shall be eligible, if reappointed, to the full number of terms 81

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83 provided by this act regardless of prior service.
