o 9	Whereas, Larry and Virginia Mitchell (the Mitchells) live at 1967 Mitchell Cross Road in Hillsville
10	in Carroll County, Virginia; and
11	Whereas, the Mitchells lease land in Hillsville upon which crops are grown, including corn; and
12	Whereas, the Mitchells estimate that a wild bear(s) destroyed approximately 20 percent of their corn
13	crop in each of 2002 and 2003; and
14	Whereas, the Mitchells estimate the cost of this destruction at \$2,000 in 2002 and \$3,000 in 2003 for
15	total losses of \$5,000; and
16	Whereas, the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (the Department) visited the Mitchell's farm
17	and confirmed that a bear(s) did destroy part of the Mitchell's corn crop; and
18	Whereas, such losses occurred in the months of August and September 2002 and the months of
19	August and September 2003; and
20	Whereas, the Mitchells assert that in the approximate period of 1998 to 2000 the Department on
21	several occasions released bears in Pulaski County; and Whenese the Mitchelle assert that the place of release in Pulaski County was should 20 miles from
22 23	Whereas, the Mitchells assert that the place of release in Pulaski County was about 30 miles from the Mitchell's farm; and
23 24	Whereas, Larry Mitchell states that he saw a bear with a radio-tracking collar around its neck in May
25	2002, approximately one-half mile from his farm; and
26	Whereas, the Mitchells state that a neighbor told them that he saw a Department truck towing a
27	trailer with a bear cage on it in the immediate vicinity of the Mitchell's farm sometime in 2000; and
28	Whereas, the Mitchells state that their neighbor could not confirm whether or not a bear was inside
29	such cage; and
30	Whereas, for the foregoing reasons, the Mitchells believe that a bear(s) released by the Department
31	was responsible for the damage to their crops; and
32 33	Whereas, the Department denies releasing any bear in the immediate vicinity of the Mitchell's farm;
33 34	and Whereas, the Mitchells state that in September of 2003 game wardens issued a warning ticket to their
35	neighbor for leaving bread near the Mitchell's corn crop; and
36	Whereas, the Department indicated that such a warning ticket was given for baiting bear; and
37	Whereas, the Mitchells state that in 2003 employees of the Department indicated that they would
38	issue them a kill permit next year if they suffer additional crop damage; and
39	Whereas, the kill permit would allow the Mitchells to kill a bear damaging their corn crop; and
40	Whereas, under § 29.1-352 of the Code of Virginia a locality may adopt a damage stamp program to
41	establish a source of funds to compensate citizens for damage to crops caused by a bear; and
42	Whereas, under the damage stamp program localities may charge hunters an annual fee of \$1 to
43	purchase such a stamp; and Whenese a person may not laufully burt here or door in a locality that has adopted a demose stamp.
44 45	Whereas, a person may not lawfully hunt bear or deer in a locality that has adopted a damage stamp program unless such person has purchased the damage stamp; and
<b>4</b> 5 <b>46</b>	Whereas, one use of the proceeds from the \$1 annual damage stamp fee is to compensate persons for
47	losses caused by bear or deer; and
48	Whereas, Carroll County has not adopted a damage stamp program and, as a result, the Mitchells
49	cannot apply for relief under such program; and
50	Whereas, the Mitchells suffered \$5,000 in economic losses from the destruction of their corn crop
51	and have no other means to obtain adequate relief accept by action of this body; now, therefore,
52	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
53	<b>1.</b> § 1. That there shall be paid for the relief of Mr. and Mrs. Larry and Virginia Mitchell (the
54	Mitchells), from the general fund of the state treasury, upon execution of a release of all claims they
55 56	may have against the Commonwealth or any agency, instrumentality, officer, employee, or political subdivision in connection with the aforesaid occurrence, the sum of \$5,000 to be paid to the Mitchells,
50 57	on or before September 1, 2004, by check issued by the State Treasurer on warrant of the Comptroller.
51	on or begore september 1, 2007, by encer issued by the state fredsuler on warrant of the comptroller.

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
