Designates that the entire length of Interstate Route 64 in Virginia the "Korean War Veterans Memorial Highway," the entire length of Interstate Route 81 in Virginia is hereby designated the "World War II Veterans Memorial Highway," and the entire length of Interstate Route 95 in Virginia is hereby designated the "Vietnam Veterans Memorial Highway." The Virginia Department of Transportation shall place and maintain appropriate markers indicating the designations of these highways; however, the cost of initially placing these markers shall be paid from private sources.
