Summary/Purpose: This bill authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds subject to the provisions of Article X, Section 9(c) of the Constitution of Virginia in an amount not to exceed \$255,316,600 plus financing costs for revenue-producing capital projects at institutions of higher education of the Commonwealth. Of this amount, \$137,700,600 relates to eighteen previously authorized projects being carried forward in this bill. The remaining \$117,616,000 is for seven new projects. The bonds are backed by the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth and therefore, constitute tax-supported debt. In addition, the bill includes an emergency clause and repeals Chapters 4 and 157 of the 2003 Acts of Assembly.					
6.	No Fiscal Impact. It is expected that the projects included in the bill will generate sufficient nongeneral fund revenues to pay operating expenses and debt service.

8.	Fiscal implications - Capital: As currently written, capital financing will be provided for seven new projects and eighteen carryover projects. Institutions will need nongeneral fund appropriations for debt service once the projects are complete. Institutions of higher education affected by the bill must set rates, fees, and/or charges at levels that will generate sufficient net revenues to retire the debt.
