5.	Summary/Purpose: The bill overrides the Statewide Fire Prevention Code regulations that prohibit the use of natural cut Christmas trees in the common areas of places of worship that do not have automatic sprinkler systems. Any person managing a place of worship that does not have an automatic sprinkler system must take all reasonable precautions to avoid fire and explosion while any natural cut Christmas tree is present in such place of worship. In October, the International Code Council building and fire codes were adopted for Virginia, which included the international fire code regulation on the use of natural cut Christmas trees.
