**4. Title** Use of natural cut Christmas trees in certain places of worship

**5. Summary/Purpose:** The bill provides that the Board of Housing and Community Development shall issue regulations, in accordance with the Administrative Process Act, to permit the use of natural cut Christmas trees in places of worship and apartment dwelling units without an approved automatic sprinkler system. The board is required to seek input from state and local fire code officials, local building code officials, and representatives of apartment dwellings and houses of worship.

The bill has an emergency enactment clause making it effective as soon as it is signed into law.
