**4. Title** Insurance; mandated coverage for biologically based mental illness; sunset repealed.

**5. Summary/Purpose:** Repeals the fifth enactment clause (sunset provision) for the sections that require parity in the coverage of biologically based mental illnesses in health care coverage for state employees pursuant to § 2.1-20.1 and for insurance policies, contracts and plans subject to § 38.2-3412.1:01. The clause would have repealed the provision effective July 1, 2004.
