That §§ 37.1-185 and 37.1-189.1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: § 37.1-185. Revocation, suspension or refusal of licenses; resumption of operation; penalty. 11 (a) A. The Commissioner is authorized to revoke or suspend any license issued hereunder, or refuse 12 issuance of a license, on any of the following grounds: (1)(i) violation of any provision of this chapter 13 or of any applicable and valid rule or regulation made pursuant to such provisions; (2)(ii) permitting, 14 15 aiding, or abetting the commission of an illegal act in services delivered by such provider; or (3)(iii)conduct or practices detrimental to the welfare of any individual receiving services from such provider. 16 (b)B. Whenever the Commissioner revokes, suspends or denies a license, the provisions of the 17 18 Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) shall apply. 19 (e)C. If a license is revoked or refused as herein provided, a new application for license may be 20 considered by the Commissioner when the conditions upon which such action was based have been 21 corrected and satisfactory evidence of this fact has been furnished. In no event, however, may an 22 applicant reapply for a license after the Commissioner has refused or revoked a license until a period of 23 six months from the effective date of such action has elapsed unless the Commissioner in his sole 24 discretion believes that there has been such a change in the conditions causing refusal of the prior 25 application or revocation of the license as to justify considering the new application. When an appeal is taken by the applicant pursuant to § 37.1-186, the six-month period shall be extended until a final 26 27 decision has been rendered on appeal. A new license may then be granted after proper inspection has 28 been made and all provisions of this chapter and applicable rules and regulations made thereunder have 29 been complied with and recommendations to such effect have been made to the Commissioner upon the 30 basis of an inspection by any authorized inspector or agent of the Department. 31  $(\mathbf{d})D$ . Suspension of a license shall in all cases be for an indefinite time and the suspension may be lifted and rights under the license fully or partially restored at such time as the Commissioner 32 33 determines, upon basis of such an inspection, that the rights of the licensee appear to so require and the 34 interests of the public will not be jeopardized by resumption of operation. 35 E. Pursuant to the procedures set forth in subsection F and in addition to the authority provided in 36 subsections A through D, the Commissioner may issue a summary order of suspension of the license of 37 a group home or residential facility for children, in conjunction with any proceeding for revocation, 38 denial, or other action, when conditions or practices exist in the home or facility that pose an 39 immediate and substantial threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the children who are residents and 40 the Commissioner believes the operation should be suspended during the pendency of such proceeding. 41 F. The summary order of suspension shall take effect upon its issuance and shall be served on the licensee or its designee as soon as practicable thereafter by personal service and certified mail, return 42 receipt requested, to the address of record of the licensee. The order shall state the time, date, and 43 location of a hearing to determine whether the suspension is appropriate. **60** § 37.1-189.1. Cooperation of Department with other state departments; penalty.

A. The Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services shall assist
 and cooperate with other state departments in fulfilling their respective licensing and certification
 responsibilities and in reducing and simplifying the regulations involved in such licensing and
 certification. The State Board may shall promulgate regulations which will that shall allow the
 Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to so assist and
 cooperate with other state departments.

67 B. Pursuant to the procedures set forth in subsection C, the Commissioner may issue a summary
68 order of suspension of the license of a group home or residential facility for children licensed pursuant
69 to the Board's regulations under subsection A, in conjunction with any proceeding for revocation,
70 denial, or other action, when conditions or practices exist in the home or facility that pose an
71 immediate and substantial threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the children who are residents and
72 the Commissioner believes the operation should be suspended during the pendency of such proceeding.

73 C. The summary order of suspension shall take effect upon its issuance and shall be served on the 74 licensee or its designee as soon as practicable thereafter by personal service and certified mail, return 75 receipt requested, to the address of record of the licensee.
