4. Title Offshore blind stake sites; penalty.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Removes the prohibition on hunting migratory waterfowl from floating blinds in the waters of Caroline, Essex, King George, Richmond, and Westmoreland Counties, and in portions of creeks, streams, and bays flowing into the Rappahannock and Potomac Rivers, through the establishment of an offshore blind stake site license. The cost of a stake site license is \$5 and there is a limit of four stake site licenses per applicant. The bill describes the various siting requirements and times when the stake sites license has to be obtained and by whom. The penalty for violation of the act is increased from a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$250 or by confinement in jail for not more than 30 days, or both, to a Class 2 misdemeanor.

8. Fiscal implications:

The bill establishes a new Class 2 misdemeanor penalty. The punishment for a Class 2 misdemeanor is confinement in jail for not more than six months and a fine of not more than \$1,000, either or both. Revenue generated from such fines is deposited to the Literary Fund. Any revenue impact will depend on the number of convictions.

Any expenditure impact to the court system will be dependent on the number of hearings. Any impact the legislation may have on jail inmate population is unknown. According to the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, the proposed legislation will not have a fiscal impact on that agency.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, court system, jails.

10. Technical amendment necessary: Yes. Line 23, insert “.” after “blind”.
