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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 22.1-79.3 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 22.1-79.3. Policies regarding certain activities.
13	A. No later than January 1, 2001, local school boards shall develop and implement policies to ensure
14	that public school students are not required to convey or deliver any materials that (i) advocate the
15	election or defeat of any candidate for elective office, (ii) advocate the passage or defeat of any
16	referendum question, or (iii) advocate the passage or defeat of any matter pending before a local school
17 18	board, local governing body or the General Assembly of Virginia or the Congress of the United States. This section shall not be construed to prohibit the discussion or use of political or issue-oriented
10 19	materials as part of classroom discussions or projects or to prohibit the delivery of informational
20	materials.
20 21	B. Local school boards shall develop and implement policies to prohibit the administration of
22	questionnaires or surveys to public school students during the regular school day or at school-sponsored
23	events without written, informed parental consent for the student's participation when participation in
24 24	such questionnaire or survey may subsequently result in the sale for commercial purposes of personal
25	information regarding the individual student.
26	C. Local school boards shall not administer questionnaires or surveys to public school students
27	during the regular school day or at school-sponsored activities if such questionnaires and surveys seek
28	disclosure of (i) the parents' political affiliations or beliefs; (ii) the social security numbers of the
29	parents or student, except as may be required for admission and enrollment; (iii) the sexual behavior
30	and attitudes of the student and his family members; or (iv) disparaging information about family
31	members.
32	Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit local school boards from administering
33	questionnaires and surveys to students during the regular school day or at school-sponsored activities
34	when the questionnaire or survey (i) is designed to elicit information that will assist the school board in
35	improving service to students within the division or within a particular school, and (ii) does not include
36	personally identifiable data or information.
37	Before administering any questionnaire or survey as permitted in this section, local school boards
38	shall determine the age-appropriateness of such questionnaire or survey.
39 40	CD. No local school board providing access and opportunity to use school facilities or to distribute
40 41	literature may deny equal access or fair opportunity to use such school facilities or to distribute
41	literature, or otherwise discriminate against the Boy Scouts of America or the Girl Scouts of the USA.
42 43	Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to require any school or school division to sponsor the
43 44	Boy Scouts of America or the Girl Scouts of the USA, or to exempt any such groups from school board
44	policies governing access to and use of school facilities and distribution of literature.
