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10	Be in enacted by the General Assembly:
11	1. That § 54.1-2928.1 of the Code of Virginia is enacted as follows:
12	§ 54.1-2928.1. Restricted volunteer license.
13	A. The Board may issue a restricted volunteer license to a practitioner of the healing arts who:
14	1. Held an unrestricted license issued by the Virginia Board of Medicine or by a board in another
15 16	state as a licensee in good standing at the time the license expired or became inactive;
10	2. Is practicing within the limits of his license in accordance with provisions of § 54.1-106; and, 3. Attests to knowledge of the laws and regulations governing his branch of the healing arts in
18	Virginia.
10 19	B. A person holding a restricted volunteer license under this section shall not be required to
20	complete continuing education for the first renewal of such a license. Subsequent renewals will require
<b>2</b> 0 <b>2</b> 1	continuing education as specified by Board regulation.
22	C. If a practitioner with a restricted volunteer license issued under this section has not held an
$\overline{23}$	active, unrestricted license and been engaged in active practice within the past four years, he shall only
24	practice his profession if a doctor of medicine or osteopathic medicine with an active, unrestricted
25	Virginia license reviews the quality of care rendered by the practitioner with the restricted volunteer
26	license at least every 90 days.
27	D. Such license may be renewed every two years in accordance with regulations promulgated by the
28	Board.
29	E. A practitioner holding a restricted volunteer license issued pursuant to this section is subject to
30	the provisions of this chapter, the regulations promulgated under this chapter, and the disciplinary
31	regulations which apply to all such practitioners in Virginia.
32	F. The application fee and the biennial renewal fee for restricted volunteer license under this section
33	shall be no more than one-half the renewal fee for an inactive license in the same branch of the healing
34	arts.
35	2. That the Board of Medicine shall promulgate regulations to implement provisions of this act
36	within 280 days of its enactment.

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
