6 7	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 56-446.1, relating to limitations
8	on passenger rail transportation liability. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9 9	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 56-446.1 as follows:
10	§ 56-446.1. Limitations on passenger rail transportation liability.
11	A. As used in this section, unless the context requires otherwise:
12	"Authority" means a political subdivision of the Commonwealth that is comprised of two
13	transportation commissions of the Commonwealth collectively engaged in providing, directly or
14	indirectly, passenger rail transportation services to the general public.
15	"Claim" means a claim, action, suit, or request for damages, whether compensatory, punitive, or
16	otherwise, made by any rail passenger against (i) an authority or a railroad, or (ii) against a member
17 18	of an authority's governing body, or a director, officer, employee, affiliate engaged in railroad operations, or agent of an authority or a railroad.
19	"Passenger rail services" means the transportation of rail passengers by or on behalf of an authority
20	and all services performed by a railroad pursuant to a contract with the authority arising from or in
21	connection with the transportation of rail passengers.
22	"Railroad" means a railroad company or railroad corporation that has entered into any contracts or
23	operating agreements of any kind with an authority for the provision of passenger rail services.
24 25	B. An authority may contract with any railroad to allocate financial responsibility for claims against
25 26	the railroad or the authority arising from or in connection with any incident or accident of any kind related to the provision of passenger rail services, which may include but not be limited to executing
27 27	indemnity agreements, notwithstanding any other statutory, common law, public policy, or other
28	prohibition against same, and regardless of the nature of the claim or the conduct giving rise to such
29	claim.
30	C. The aggregate liability of the authority and any applicable railroad for all claims of rail
31	passengers arising from a single incident or accident of any kind involving passenger rail services
32	owned and operated by a multi-jurisdictional government for property damage, personal injury, bodily
33 34	injury, and death shall be limited to \$250 million per single incident or accident. D. The limitation on aggregate liability provided in this section shall be modified each year,
35	beginning in January, 2011, and continuing each January thereafter, by adjusting the amount of the
36	limitation by a percentage equal to the percentage change in the medical care component of the
37	Consumer Price Index, as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, over that component published
38	for the previous December.
39	E. This section shall not affect the damages that may be recovered under the Federal Employers'
40	Liability Act of 1908 (45 U.S.C. § 51 et seq.), as amended.
41 42	F. The Virginia Division of Risk Management shall be designated to examine the history of claims
42 43	made and amounts recovered against authorities and railroads arising from or in connection with the provision of passenger rail services, and to complete its review by November 30, 2011.
4 4	<i>G. This section shall not affect the damages that may be recovered for a claim if it can be shown</i>
45	that the accident or injury occurred as a result of willful and wanton conduct on the part of the
46	railroad.

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
