4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-290.01 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Virginia Teaching
5	Scholarship Loan Program.

10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 22.1-290.01 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 22.1-290.01. Virginia Teaching Scholarship Loan Program established; purpose; Board of Education
13	to administer Program; eligibility requirements for scholarship and awards; collaboration and
14	consultation with State Council of Higher Education; repayment of scholarship required.
15	A. With such funds as may be appropriated for this purpose and any gifts, donations, grants,
16	bequests, and other funds that may be received on behalf of the Program by the Board of Education,
17	there is hereby established the Virginia Teaching Scholarship Loan Program, hereinafter referred to as
18	the "Program," to: (i) increase the number of students pursuing careers in teaching and students seeking endorsements in elementary and middle school education; (ii) increase the number of teachers in the
19 20	critical teacher shortage disciplines, including special education, as established by the Board; (iii)
20 21	increase the number of teachers in a school division with a shortage of teachers in any discipline or at
22	any grade level, as defined in the Board of Education's Regulations Governing the Determination of
$\frac{1}{23}$	Critical Teacher Shortage Areas; (iv) assist paraprofessionals enrolled as full-time or part-time students
24 24	in an approved teacher education program in completing the program to become fully licensed teachers;
25	(v) expand eligibility to sophomores, students enrolled full-time or part-time in an approved teacher
26	education program; and (vi) increase the diversity of persons pursuing careers in teaching.
27	The Program shall consist of seven components:
28	1. Awards to students pursuing teacher licensure;
29	2. Awards to students pursuing teacher licensure in critical teacher shortage disciplines;
30	3. Awards to assist paraprofessionals in completing an approved teacher education program to
31	become fully licensed teachers;
32	4. Awards to sophomores and full-time and part-time students enrolled in an approved teacher
33	education program;
34	5. Awards to persons identified by a school board to teach in a discipline or at a grade level within
35	the school division in which a shortage of teachers exists, as defined in the Board of Education's
36	Regulations Governing the Determination of Critical Teacher Shortage Areas. However, such persons
37	shall meet the qualifications for awards granted pursuant to this section;
38	6. Awards to students enrolled in any area of an approved teacher education program seeking
39	endorsements in elementary or middle school education; and
40 41	7. Awards to students of diverse backgrounds, pursuant to subsection B.
41 42	B. In addition, there is hereby established within the Virginia Teaching Scholarship Loan Program a
42 43	component focused solely on increasing diversity among teachers by providing incentives for students of diverse backgrounds to pursue careers in teaching, which shall be known as the Diversity in Teaching
4 4	Initiative. The Diversity in Teaching Initiative shall provide scholarships to students of diverse
45	backgrounds enrolled in approved undergraduate and graduate teacher education programs and shall be
46	funded with such moneys as may be appropriated for this purpose, and any gifts, donations, grants,
47	bequests, and other funds as may be received on its behalf by the Board of Education and deposited in
48	the Virginia Teaching Scholarship Loan Fund pursuant to subsection G. The Board shall establish
49	procedures and criteria, in consultation with the Office of the Attorney General, for awarding the
50	Diversity in Teaching Initiative scholarships.
51	C. The Board of Education shall establish, in regulation, criteria for determining critical teacher
52	shortage areas and disciplines for awarding scholarships pursuant to this section. The criteria shall
53	include such factors as the needs in teacher endorsement areas among the several school divisions of the
54	Commonwealth, teacher shortages at the elementary and secondary grade levels, and teacher shortages in
55	rural and urban regions of the Commonwealth. The Program shall be administered by the Board of
56	Education, which shall promulgate such regulations as may be necessary for the implementation of the
57	Program. The Board shall consult with the State Council of Higher Education in the development and
58	implementation of the Program.

59 D. The Program shall consist of scholarships awarded annually to undergraduate students in the 60 sophomore, junior, or senior year of college, and to graduate students at an accredited public or private four-year institution of higher education in the Commonwealth, who (i) are enrolled full-time or 61 62 part-time in an approved teacher education program, or in a critical teacher shortage discipline, as 63 established by the Board of Education; (ii) are enrolled in any area of an approved teacher education 64 program seeking endorsements in elementary or middle school education; (iii) are of diverse 65 backgrounds and enrolled in approved undergraduate and graduate teacher education programs, pursuant to subsection B; (iv) are employed as paraprofessionals and are enrolled full-time or part-time to 66 complete an approved teacher education program to become fully licensed teachers; (v) has been 67 identified by a school board to teach in a discipline or at a grade level within the school division in 68 which a shortage of teachers exists, as defined in the Board of Education's Regulations Governing the 69 70 Determination of Critical Teacher Shortage Areas; (vi) have and maintain a cumulative grade point 71 average of at least 2.7 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent; and (vii) are nominated for such scholarship by 72 the institution where they are enrolled.

73 E. Before any teaching scholarship is awarded in accordance with the provisions of this section, the 74 scholarship recipient shall sign a promissory note under which he agrees (i) to pursue an approved 75 teacher education or graduate education program full-time or part-time at an accredited public or private four-year institution of higher education in Virginia until his graduation and (ii) upon graduation, to 76 77 begin teaching in the public schools of the Commonwealth in a critical teaching shortage discipline or, 78 regardless of teaching discipline, in a school with a high concentration of students eligible for free or 79 reduced lunch or in a rural or urban region of the Commonwealth with a teacher shortage, or in a 80 private school in the Commonwealth in the area of special education.

81 Upon graduation, the scholarship recipient shall begin teaching in the public schools of the Commonwealth or in a private school in the Commonwealth in the area of special education in the first 82 83 full academic year after graduating from college and becoming eligible for a teaching license, and shall thereafter teach continuously in Virginia for the same number of years that he was the beneficiary of 84 85 such scholarship. Such scholarship recipient may fulfill the teaching obligation by accepting a teaching 86 position (i) in one of the critical teacher shortage disciplines as established by the Board of Education; 87 or (ii) regardless of teaching discipline, in a school with a high concentration of students eligible for 88 free or reduced lunch; or (iii) in any discipline or at any grade level within a school division with a 89 shortage of teachers, as defined in the Board of Education's Regulations Governing the Determination of 90 Critical Teacher Shortage Areas; or (iv) in a rural or urban region of the state with a teacher shortage; 91 or (v) in a private school in the Commonwealth in the area of special education. The Board of 92 Education may recover the total amount of funds awarded as a scholarship, or the appropriate proportion 93 thereof, including any accrued interest, if the scholarship recipient fails to honor the teaching obligation.

94 F. To ensure a more diverse representation among classroom teachers, especially at the elementary 95 and middle grade levels, the Diversity in Teaching Initiative shall consist of no more than five pilot projects, geographically distributed across the Commonwealth, and shall be designed to attract and 96 97 encourage elementary and secondary school students, particularly students of diverse backgrounds, to 98 pursue a career in teaching. The pilot projects shall be developed in accordance with the provisions of 99 the appropriation act governing the administration of the Better Information Project within the Pre-Collegiate Program under the Virginia Plan for Equal Educational Opportunity in Higher Education. 100 101 The pilot projects may include outreach activities such as mentorship programs, linkages between public schools and institutions of higher education, and other programs and activities designed to generate 102 interest in the teaching profession. The Board shall require the evaluation of each pilot project before 103 104 implementing this component of the Diversity in Teaching Initiative statewide.

G. There is hereby created in the Department of the Treasury a special nonreverting fund known as 105 the Virginia Teaching Scholarship Loan Fund, hereinafter referred to as the "Fund." The Fund shall be 106 107 established on the books of the Comptroller, and any moneys remaining in the Fund at the end of the 108 biennium shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. The Fund shall consist of 109 such moneys as may be appropriated for the Virginia Teaching Scholarship Loan Program and such gifts, donations, grants, bequests, and other funds as may be received on its behalf by the Board of 110 111 Education. The Fund shall be used solely to fund the Virginia Teaching Scholarship Loan Program. Interest earned on such moneys shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Moneys in the Fund shall 112 113 be used solely to award scholarships pursuant to the Virginia Teaching Scholarship Loan Program as provided in this section. Disbursements from the Fund for such scholarships shall be made by the State 114 115 Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request of the President of the Board of Education. The State Treasurer shall ensure that any moneys appropriated or provided to the Fund for 116 the Diversity in Teaching Initiative through appropriations, gifts, donations, grants, and bequests shall be 117 accounted for separately and distributed only for scholarships awarded pursuant to the Diversity in 118 119 Teaching Initiative.

120 H. The Board of Education and the State Council of Higher Education shall make available to

121 parents, students, teachers, high school guidance counselors, and academic advisors and financial aid122 administrators at public and private institutions of higher education information concerning the Virginia

123 Teacher Scholarship Loan Program, including the Diversity in Teaching Initiative, eligibility for the

124 loans, and the terms and conditions under which such loans are awarded, in order that students 125 interested in pursuing careers in the teaching profession may be advised of the availability of such

126 financial assistance.

127 I. For the purposes of this section, "critical teacher shortage area and discipline" means subject areas
128 and grade levels identified by the Board of Education in which the demand for classroom teachers
129 exceeds the supply of teachers, as defined in the Board of Education's Regulations Governing the
130 Determination of Critical Teacher Shortage Areas.

J. For the purposes of this section, "paraprofessional" means a full-time member of a school staff
 whose primary responsibility is to support instructional programs under the direction of licensed
 instructional personnel.
