4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 46.2-208 of the Code of Virginia, relating to records of the Department
5	of Motor Vehicles; free abstracts for certain volunteer vehicle operators.

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 46.2-208 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-208. Records of Department; when open for inspection; release of privileged information.
13	A. All records in the office of the Department containing the specific classes of information outlined
14	below shall be considered privileged records:
15	1. Personal information, including all data defined as "personal information" in § 2.2-3801;
16	2. Driver information, including all data that relates to driver's license status and driver activity; and
17	3. Vehicle information, including all descriptive vehicle data and title, registration, and vehicle
18	activity data.
19	B. The Commissioner shall release such information only under the following conditions:
20	1. Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, medical data included in personal data shall be
21	released only to a physician or nurse practitioner as provided in § 46.2-322.
22	2. Insurance data may be released as specified in §§ 46.2-372, 46.2-380, and 46.2-706.
23	3. Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, information disclosed or furnished shall be
24	assessed a fee as specified in § 46.2-214.
25	4. When the person requesting the information is (i) the subject of the information, (ii) the parent or
26	guardian of the subject of the information, (iii) the authorized representative of the subject of the
27	information, or (iv) the owner of the vehicle that is the subject of the information, the Commissioner
28	shall provide him with the requested information and a complete explanation of it. Requests for such
29	information need not be made in writing or in person and may be made orally or by telephone, provided
30	that the Department is satisfied that there is adequate verification of the requester's identity. When so
31	requested in writing by (a) the subject of the information, (b) the parent or guardian of the subject of
32	the information, (c) the authorized representative of the subject of the information, or (d) the owner of
33	the vehicle that is the subject of the information, the Commissioner shall verify and, if necessary, correct
34	the personal information provided and furnish driver and vehicle information in the form of an abstract
35	of the record.
36	5. On the written request of any insurance carrier, surety, or representative of an insurance carrier or
37	surety, the Commissioner shall furnish such insurance carrier, surety, or representative an abstract of the
38	record of any person subject to the provisions of this title. The abstract shall include any record of any
39	conviction of a violation of any provision of any statute or ordinance relating to the operation or
40	ownership of a motor vehicle or of any injury or damage in which he was involved and a report of
41	which is required by § 46.2-372. No such report of any conviction or accident shall be made after 60
42 43	months from the date of the conviction or accident unless the Commissioner or court used the
43 44	conviction or accident as a reason for the suspension or revocation of a driver's license or driving
45	privilege, in which case the revocation or suspension and any conviction or accident pertaining thereto shall not be reported after 60 months from the date that the driver's license or driving privilege has been
4 6	reinstated. This abstract shall not be admissible in evidence in any court proceedings.
47	6. On the written request of any business organization or its agent, in the conduct of its business, the
48	Commissioner shall compare personal information supplied by the business organization or agent with
49	that contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied by the business
50	organization or agent is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the business
50 51	organization or agent with correct information as contained in the Department's records, provide the business
52	information provided under this subdivision shall be used solely for the purpose of pursuing remedies
53	that require locating an individual.
54	7. The Commissioner shall provide vehicle information to any business organization or agent on such
55	business' or agent's written request. Disclosures made under this subdivision shall not include any
56	personal information and shall not be subject to the limitations contained in subdivision 6 of this
57	subsection.
58	8. On the written request of any motor vehicle rental or leasing company or its designated agent, the

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59 Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by the company or agent with that 60 contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied by the company or agent is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the company or agent with correct 61 information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide the company or agent with driver 62 63 information in the form of an abstract of any person subject to the provisions of this title. Such abstract 64 shall include any record of any conviction of a violation of any provision of any statute or ordinance 65 relating to the operation or ownership of a motor vehicle or of any injury or damage in which the subject of the abstract was involved and a report of which is required by § 46.2-372. No such abstract 66 shall include any record of any conviction or accident more than 60 months after the date of such 67 68 conviction or accident unless the Commissioner or court used the conviction or accident as a reason for 69 the suspension or revocation of a driver's license or driving privilege, in which case the revocation or 70 suspension and any conviction or accident pertaining thereto shall cease to be included in such abstract 71 after 60 months from the date on which the driver's license or driving privilege was reinstated. No 72 abstract released under this subdivision shall be admissible in evidence in any court proceedings.

73 9. On the request of any federal, state, or local governmental entity, law-enforcement officer, attorney 74 for the Commonwealth, court, or the authorized agent of any of the foregoing, the Commissioner shall 75 (i) compare personal information supplied by the governmental entity, officer, attorney for the Commonwealth, court, or the authorized agent of any of the foregoing, with that contained in the 76 77 Department's records and, when the information supplied by the governmental entity, officer, attorney 78 for the Commonwealth, court, or the authorized agent of any of the foregoing, is different from that 79 contained in the Department's records, provide the governmental entity, officer, attorney for the Commonwealth, court, or the authorized agent of any of the foregoing, with correct information as 80 81 contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver and vehicle information in the form of an abstract of the record showing all convictions, accidents, driver's license suspensions or revocations, and 82 83 other appropriate information as the governmental entity, officer, attorney for the Commonwealth, court, 84 or the authorized agent of any of the foregoing, may require in order to carry out its official functions.

85 10. On request of the driver licensing authority in any other state or foreign country, the
86 Commissioner shall provide whatever classes of information the requesting authority shall require in
87 order to carry out its official functions.

11. On the written request of any employer, prospective employer, or authorized agent of either, and 88 89 with the written consent of the individual concerned, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal 90 information supplied by the employer, prospective employer, or agent with that contained in the 91 Department's records and, when the information supplied by the employer, prospective employer, or 92 agent is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the employer, prospective 93 employer, or agent with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide the employer, prospective employer, or agent with driver information in the form of an abstract of an 94 95 individual's record showing all convictions, accidents, driver's license suspensions or revocations, and 96 any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses, provided that the individual's position or the position that the individual is being considered for involves the operation of a motor vehicle. 97

98 12. On the written request of any member of or applicant for membership in a volunteer fire 99 company or volunteer rescue squad, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied 100 by the volunteer fire company or volunteer rescue squad with that contained in the Department's records 101 and, when the information supplied by the volunteer fire company or volunteer rescue squad is different 102 from that contained in the Department's records, provide the volunteer fire company or volunteer rescue squad with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver 103 information in the form of an abstract of the member's or applicant's record showing all convictions, 104 accidents, license suspensions or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual 105 currently possesses. Such abstract shall be provided free of charge if the request is accompanied by 106 107 appropriate written evidence that the person is a member of or applicant for membership in a volunteer 108 fire company or volunteer rescue squad and the abstract is needed by a volunteer fire company or 109 volunteer rescue squad to establish the qualifications of the member or applicant to operate equipment 110 owned by the volunteer fire company or volunteer rescue squad.

111 13. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer with a Virginia affiliate 112 of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of America, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by a Virginia affiliate of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of America with that contained in the 113 Department's records and, when the information supplied by a Virginia affiliate of Big Brothers/Big 114 115 Sisters of America is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the Virginia affiliate of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of America with correct information as contained in the 116 117 Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in the form of an abstract of the applicant's record showing all convictions, accidents, license suspensions or revocations, and any type of driver's 118 119 license that the individual currently possesses. Such abstract shall be provided free of charge if the 120 request is accompanied by appropriate written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer

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121 with a Virginia affiliate of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of America.

122 14. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer with a court-appointed 123 special advocate program pursuant to § 9.1-153, the Commissioner shall provide an abstract of the 124 applicant's record showing all convictions, accidents, license suspensions or revocations, and any type of 125 driver's license that the individual currently possesses. Such abstract shall be provided free of charge if 126 the request is accompanied by appropriate written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer 127 with a court-appointed special advocate program pursuant to § 9.1-153.

128 15. Upon the request of any employer, prospective employer, or authorized representative of either, 129 the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by the employer, prospective 130 employer, or agent with that contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied 131 by the employer, prospective employer, or agent is different from that contained in the Department's 132 records, provide the employer, prospective employer, or agent with correct information as contained in 133 the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in the form of an abstract of the driving record of any individual who has been issued a commercial driver's license, provided that the 134 135 individual's position or the position that the individual is being considered for involves the operation of 136 a commercial motor vehicle. Such abstract shall show all convictions, accidents, license suspensions, 137 revocations, or disqualifications, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses.

138 16. Upon the receipt of a completed application and payment of applicable processing fees, the
139 Commissioner may enter into an agreement with any governmental authority or business to exchange
140 information specified in this section by electronic or other means.

141 17. Upon the request of an attorney representing a person in a motor vehicle accident, the
 142 Commissioner shall provide vehicle information, including the owner's name and address, to the
 143 attorney.

144 18. Upon the request, in the course of business, of any authorized representative of an insurance 145 company or of any not-for-profit entity organized to prevent and detect insurance fraud, or perform 146 rating and underwriting activities, the Commissioner shall provide to such person (i) all vehicle 147 information, including the owner's name and address, descriptive data and title, registration, and vehicle 148 activity data as requested or (ii) all driver information including name, license number and classification, 149 date of birth, and address information for each driver under the age of 22 licensed in the 150 Commonwealth of Virginia meeting the request criteria designated by such person, with such request 151 criteria consisting of driver's license number or address information. No such information shall be used 152 for solicitation of sales, marketing, or other commercial purposes.

153 19. Upon the request of an officer authorized to issue criminal warrants, for the purpose of issuing a
154 warrant for arrest for unlawful disposal of trash or refuse in violation of § 33.1-346, the Commissioner
155 shall provide vehicle information, including the owner's name and address.

156 20. Upon written request of the compliance agent of a private security services business, as defined
157 in § 9.1-138, which is licensed by the Department of Criminal Justice Services, the Commissioner shall
158 provide the name and address of the owner of the vehicle under procedures determined by the
159 Commissioner.

160 21. Upon the request of the operator of a toll facility, or an authorized agent or employee of a toll facility operator, for the purpose of obtaining vehicle owner data under subsection I of § 46.2-819.1.

162 22. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer with a Virginia affiliate 163 of Compeer, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information supplied by a Virginia affiliate of 164 Compeer with that contained in the Department's records and, when the information supplied by a 165 Virginia affiliate of Competer is different from that contained in the Department's records, provide the 166 Virginia affiliate of Compeer with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) 167 provide driver information in the form of an abstract of the applicant's record showing all convictions, accidents, license suspensions or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual 168 currently possesses. Such abstract shall be provided free of charge if the request is accompanied by 169 170 appropriate written evidence that the person has applied to be a volunteer with a Virginia affiliate of 171 Compeer.

172 23. Upon the request of the Department of Environmental Quality for the purpose of obtaining
173 vehicle owner data in connection with enforcement actions involving on-road testing of motor vehicles,
174 pursuant to § 46.2-1178.1.

175 24. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with a
176 Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information
177 supplied by a Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross with that contained in the Department's
178 records and, when the information supplied by a Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross is different
179 from that contained in the Department's records, provide the Virginia chapter of the American Red Cross
180 with correct information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in
181 the form of an abstract of the applicant's record showing all convictions, accidents, license suspensions

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182 or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses. Such abstract
183 shall be provided free of charge if the request is accompanied by appropriate written evidence that the
184 person has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with a Virginia chapter of the American Red
185 Cross.

186 25. On the written request of any person who has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with a 187 Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol, the Commissioner shall (i) compare personal information 188 supplied by a Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol with that contained in the Department's records 189 and, when the information supplied by a Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol is different from that 190 contained in the Department's records, provide the Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol with correct 191 information as contained in the Department's records and (ii) provide driver information in the form of 192 an abstract of the applicant's record showing all convictions, accidents, license suspensions or revocations, and any type of driver's license that the individual currently possesses. Such abstract shall 193 194 be provided free of charge if the request is accompanied by appropriate written evidence that the person 195 has applied to be a volunteer vehicle operator with a Virginia chapter of the Civil Air Patrol.

C. Whenever the Commissioner issues an order to suspend or revoke the driver's license or driving
privilege of any individual, he may notify the National Driver Register Service operated by the United
States Department of Transportation and any similar national driver information system and provide
whatever classes of information the authority may require.

D. Accident reports may be inspected under the provisions of §§ 46.2-379 and 46.2-380.

E. Whenever the Commissioner takes any licensing action pursuant to the provisions of the Virginia
 Commercial Driver's License Act (§ 46.2-341.1 et seq.), he may provide information to the Commercial
 Driver License Information System, or any similar national commercial driver information system,
 regarding such action.

F. In addition to the foregoing provisions of this section, vehicle information may also be inspected under the provisions of §§ 43-33, 43-34, 46.2-633, and §§ 46.2-1200.1 through 46.2-1237.

207 G. The Department may promulgate regulations to govern the means by which personal, vehicle, and208 driver information is requested and disseminated.

H. Driving records of any person accused of an offense involving the operation of a motor vehicle
shall be provided by the Commissioner upon request to any person acting as counsel for the accused. If
such counsel is from the public defender's office or has been appointed by the court, such records shall
be provided free of charge.

I. The Department shall maintain the records of persons convicted of violations of § 18.2-36.2,
subsection B of § 29.1-738, and §§ 29.1-738.02, 29.1-738.2, and 29.1-738.4 which shall be forwarded by
every general district court or circuit court or the clerk thereof, pursuant to § 46.2-383. Such records
shall be electronically available to any law-enforcement officer as provided for under clause (ii) of
subdivision B 9.
