On the first day of July next following the regular municipal election, or if such day be Saturday or unday, then on the following Tuesday, the council shall meet at the usual place for holding meetings the legislative body of the city, at which time the newly elected council members shall assume the ties of their office. The time for any such meeting shall be set by ordinance adopted by council not ss than thirty nor more than forty-five days prior to the election. Thereafter the council shall meet at the times as may be prescribed by ordinance or resolution. It shall hold at least one regular meeting the week, provided that it may, by the affirmative vote of a majority of its members, dispense with any welve 16 such regular meetings in any calendar year. The mayor, any member of the council, or the ty manager, may call special meetings of the council at any time upon at least twelve hours' written otice to each member, served personally or left at his usual place of business or residence; or such eeting may be held at any time without notice, provided all members of the council attend. All eetings of the council shall be public except where closed pursuant to the provisions of general law, and any citizen may have access to the minutes and records thereof at all reasonable times. § 100. Sale of public property. The rights of the city of Norfolk in and to its water-front, wharf property, public landings, wharves, pocks, streets, avenues, parks, bridges and other public places and its gas, water, electric and other orks shall not be sold except by an ordinance passed by a recorded affirmative vote of <del>four fifths</del>
