11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That §§ 24.2-503, 24.2-507, 24.2-510, 24.2-515, and 24.2-515.1 of the Code of Virginia are
13	amended and reenacted as follows:
14	§ 24.2-503. Deadlines for filing required statements; extensions.
15	The written statements of qualification and economic interests shall be filed by (i) primary candidates
16	not later than the filing deadline for the primary, (ii) all other candidates for city and town offices to be
17	filled at a May general election by 7:00 p.m. on the first Tuesday in March, (iii) candidates in special
18	elections by the time of qualifying as a candidate, and (iv) all other candidates by 7:00 p.m. on the
19 20	second Tuesday in June September.
20 21	A statement shall be deemed to be timely filed if it is mailed postage prepaid to the appropriate office by registered or certified mail and if the official receipt therefor, which shall be exhibited on
$\frac{21}{22}$	demand, shows mailing within the prescribed time limits.
$\frac{22}{23}$	The State Board may grant an extension of any deadline for filing either or both written statements
23 24	and shall notify all candidates who have not filed their statements of the extension. Any extension shall
25	be granted for a fixed period of time of ten days from the date of the mailing of the notice of the
26	extension.
27	§ 24.2-507. Deadlines for filing declarations and petitions of candidacy.
28	For any office, declarations of candidacy and the petitions therefor shall be filed according to the
29	following schedule:
30	1. For a general election in November, by 7:00 p.m. on the second Tuesday in June September;
31	2. For a general election in May, by 7:00 p.m. on the first Tuesday in March;
32	3. For a special election held at the same time as a November general election, either (i) at least
33 34	seventy-four days before the election or (ii) if the special election is being held at the second November election after the vacancy occurred, by 7:00 p.m. on the second Tuesday in June September before that
34 35	November election;
36	4. For a special election held at the same time as a May general election, by 7:00 p.m. on the first
37	Tuesday in March; or
38	5. For a special election held at a time other than a general election, (i) at least thirty days before the
39	election or (ii) within five days of any writ of election or order calling a special election to be held less
40	than thirty-five days after the issuance of the writ or order.
41	§ 24.2-510. Deadlines for parties to nominate by methods other than primary.
42	For any office, nominations by political parties by methods other than a primary shall be made and
43	completed in the manner prescribed by law according to the following schedule:
44	1. For a general election in November, by 7:00 p.m. on the second Tuesday in June September;
45 46	2. For a general election in May, by 7:00 p.m. on the first Tuesday in March;
40 47	3. For a special election held at the same time as a November general election, either (i) at least seventy-four days before the election or (ii) if the special election is held at the second November
48	election after the vacancy occurred, by 7:00 p.m. on the second Tuesday in June September before that
49	November election:
50	4. For a special election held at the same time as a May general election, by 7:00 p.m. on the first
51	Tuesday in March; or
52	5. For a special election held at a time other than a general election, (i) at least thirty days before the
53	election or (ii) within five days of any writ of election or order calling a special election to be held less
54	than thirty-five days after the issuance of the writ or order.
55	In the case of all general elections a party shall nominate its candidate for any office by a
56 57	nonprimary method only within the thirty-two days immediately preceding the primary date established
57 58	for nominating candidates for the office in question. This limitation shall have no effect, however, on
58	nominations for special elections or pursuant to § 24.2-539.

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**59** § 24.2-515. Primaries generally; presidential year primaries.

60 Primaries for the nomination of candidates for offices to be voted on at the general election date in 61 November shall be held on the second Tuesday in June September next preceding such election, except 62 that beginning with the year 2004 and in presidential election years thereafter, primaries to choose 63 among presidential candidates may be held as provided below in Article 7 (§ 24.2-544 et seq.) of this 64 chapter on the second Tuesday in February. Primaries for the nomination of candidates for offices to be voted on at the general election date in May shall be held on the first Tuesday in March next preceding 65 such election, except that beginning with the year 2004 and in presidential election years thereafter, 66 primaries for the nomination of candidates for offices to be voted on at the general election date in May 67 68 shall be held as described below in Article 7 of this chapter on the second Tuesday in February. § 24.2-515.1. Schedule for primaries in the year 2001 and each tenth year thereafter. 69

70 Primaries for the nomination of candidates for the offices listed in Section 4 of Article VII of the 71 Constitution of Virginia to be voted on at the general election in November 2001 and each tenth year

thereafter shall be held on the second Tuesday in June September next preceding such election
notwithstanding any special primary schedule enacted for any other office.
