WHEREAS, in 1990, Bob Burnley joined the engineering firm of Olver, Inc., in Blacksburg as the
 associate director of Environmental Programs, advising local government and industrial clients on
 environmental issues; and

19 WHEREAS, in 1991, Bob Burnley returned to state government as the deputy executive director of
20 the State Water Control Board and was responsible for regulatory programs statewide and the operations
21 of six regional offices; and

WHEREAS, with the formation of the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality, Bob Burnley
 was appointed director of the Water Division in 1993 and was promoted to director of Program Support
 and Evaluation in 1994; and

WHEREAS, in 1997, Bob Burnley became the director of Technical Services for the Virginia
 Economic Development Partnership, working with new and expanding industries, as well as local
 economic development agencies; and

WHEREAS, because of Bob Burnley's vast experience and superb leadership, Governor Mark R.
Warner appointed him as the director of the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality in 2002; now, therefore, be it
