**5. Summary/Purpose:**

Current law makes it a Class 1 or Class 2 misdemeanor to manufacture or possess a facsimile driver's license or a facsimile of any identification card that is produced in such a way that it could be mistaken for a valid license or identification. With one exception, the proposed legislation would enable such manufacture or possession to be prosecuted as forgery or uttering, which are Class 5 felonies. The exception is the use of such facsimile license or identification card as proof of age.

**8. Fiscal implications:**

Due to the lack of data, the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission has determined, pursuant to §30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, that the impact of the proposed legislation on state-responsible (prison) bed space cannot be determined. However, it is expected that the impact will be negligible.
