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9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 33.1-223.2:12 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 33.1-223.2:12. Tolls may vary to encourage travel during off-peak hours; certain toll facilities to
12	fully electronic.
13	In order to provide an incentive for motorists to travel at off-peak hours, wherever a toll is imposed
14	and collected by the Department or such other entity as may be responsible for imposing or collecting
15	such toll, the amount of such toll may vary according to the time of day, day of the week, traffic
16	volume, vehicle speed, vehicle type, or any or all of these variables. The amount of such toll and the
17	time of day when such toll shall change shall be as fixed and revised by the Commonwealth
18	Transportation Board or such other entity as may be responsible for fixing or revising the amount of
19	such toll; provided, however, that any such variation shall be reasonably calculated to minimize the
20	reduction in toll revenue generated by such toll.
21	Any and all toll facilities controlled by the Department shall, on or before July 1, 2008, be capable
22	of fully automated electronic operation, regardless of the date on which any such facility was or shall
23	have been constructed.
24	2. That the Department shall, on or prior to July 1, 2007, submit a written report to the General
25	Assembly on its plans to create opportunities to enhance mobility and free-flowing traffic on
26	Department-controlled toll facilities by embracing technological advances.
