- 8 WHEREAS, Officer Darden is remembered for his valiant performance as a law-enforcement officer 9 and for his devotion to his faith, family, and fellow officers; and
- WHEREAS, Seneca Darden was born on June 30, 1980, in Franklin, for most of his youth grew up 10 in Courtland, and later relocated with his family to Portsmouth; and 11
- WHEREAS, a 1998 graduate of Southampton High School, Seneca Darden majored in public 12 13 administration at Virginia State University and aspired to be a dedicated police officer like his uncle; 14 and
- WHEREAS, Seneca Darden joined the Norfolk Police Department in September 2002 and served the 15 residents of Norfolk for over four years as an outstanding public servant; and 16
- WHEREAS, Seneca Darden was a faithful and enthusiastic member of the Pleasant Grove Baptist 17 18 Church in Drewryville, participated in its numerous ministries, and sang in its inspirational male chorus; 19 and 20
  - WHEREAS, Officer Darden will be remembered for his generous and compassionate nature and his ability to bring laughter and happiness to everyone he knew; he immensely enjoyed the thrill of riding his motorcycle with his fellow officers and friends; and
