5 WHEREAS, India Meissel of the Suffolk Public Schools is recognized as the 2006-2007 National
7 Outstanding Social Studies Teacher of the Year; and

8 WHEREAS, a teacher at Lakeland High School, India Meissel is the current Virginia Council for the
9 Social Studies 2005-2006 Teacher of Year, as well as the inaugural recipient of the Mary V. Bicouvaris
10 Award for Excellence—in honor of Virginia's first National Teacher of the Year; and

WHEREAS, the National Outstanding Social Studies Teacher of the Year includes a \$2,500 cash
prize and is awarded by the National Council for the Social Studies (NCSS) at its annual conference,
