14 15	A. Any alien who is present in the United States illegally, as verified by the Law Enforcement Support Center of the Burgey of Immigration and Customs Enforcement of the United States Department
15 16	Support Center of the Bureau of Immigration and Customs Enforcement of the United States Department of Homeland Security, is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
17	B. Subsection A shall not apply to any alien who is actively and lawfully seeking political asylum in
18	the United States.
19	§ 19.2-81.6. Authority of law-enforcement officers to arrest illegal aliens.
20	All law-enforcement officers enumerated in § 19.2-81 shall have the authority to enforce immigration
21	laws of the United States, pursuant to the provisions of this section. Any law-enforcement officer
22	enumerated in § 19.2-81 may, in the course of acting upon reasonable suspicion that an individual has
23	committed or is committing a crime or a traffic infraction, arrest the individual without a warrant upon
24	receiving confirmation from the Law Enforcement Support Center of the Bureau of Immigration and
