10 11	WIEDEAS the Standards of Learning (SOL) for Virginia public schools describe the
11	WHEREAS, the Standards of Learning (SOL) for Virginia public schools describe the Commonwealth's expectations for student learning and achievement in grades K-12 in English,
12	mathematics, science, history and social science, technology, the fine arts, foreign language, health and
13 14	physical education, and driver's education; and
15	WHEREAS, students in grades three through eight are required to take an SOL assessment in
16	English, math, science, and history and social science; and
17	WHEREAS, to earn a standard or advanced studies diploma high school students are required to take
18	at least six end-of-course SOL assessments during their time in high school; and
19	WHEREAS, the Department of Education estimates that over 3,000,000 SOL assessments will be
20	taken during the 2006-2007 school year, costing approximately 29 million dollars in state funds; and
21	WHEREAS, new and emerging technologies may assist in the administration of the SOL assessments
22	at a great savings to the Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Board of Education be
24	requested to work with the Prince William County School Division to determine the feasibility and cost
25	effectiveness of utilizing alternative low-cost technologies to administer the Standards of Learning
26	assessments. Such technologies may include, but not be limited to, hand-held, remote control devices
27	that electronically record and transmit assessment data. Additionally, the Board of Education should
28	consider a pilot program to implement such alternative devices at a high school within the Prince
29	William County School Division.
30	The Board of Education shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive
31	summary and report of its progress in meeting the requests of this resolution no later than the first day
32	of the 2008 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary and report shall be
