11	each house agreeing, That the following amendment to the Constitution of Virginia be, and the same
12	hereby is, proposed and referred to the General Assembly at its first regular session held after the next
13	general election of members of the House of Delegates for its concurrence in conformity with the
14	provisions of Section 1 of Article XII of the Constitution of Virginia, namely:
15	Amend Section 15-A of Article I of the Constitution of Virginia as follows:
16	ARTICLE I
17	BILL OF RIGHTS
18 10	Section 15-A. Marriage.
19 20	That only a union between one man and one woman may be a marriage valid in or recognized by this Commonwealth and its political subdivisions.
20 21	This Commonwealth and its political subdivisions shall not create or recognize a legal status for
21 22	relationships of unmarried individuals that intends to approximate the design, qualities, significance, or
$\frac{22}{23}$	effects of marriage. Nor shall this Commonwealth or its political subdivisions create or recognize
23 24	another union, partnership, or other legal status to which is assigned the rights, benefits, obligations,
