## **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 346**

Celebrating the life of Frank McCormick Lacy.

5 Patrons-Reynolds; Delegate: Armstrong 6 7 WHEREAS, Frank McCormick Lacy of Martinsville, a respected community benefactor and retired 8 textile executive, died on October 19, 2006; and WHEREAS, a native of Halifax, Frank McCormick Lacy was born on February 20, 1909, to 9 10 Margaret McCormick and Edward Slate Lacy; and WHEREAS, Frank Lacy was the founder of Lacy Manufacturing Corporation, which was a leading 11 textile producer at the height of the industry's prominence in Martinsville; and 12 WHEREAS, Frank Lacy graduated from Halifax High School in 1926 and received a bachelor's 13 14 degree from the University of Richmond in 1930; and WHEREAS, after college, Frank Lacy moved to Martinsville, where he coached, taught high school, 15 16 and served as principal; and WHEREAS, Frank Lacy returned to Halifax for a short time to help at his father's car dealership 17 until manufacturers turned from making automobiles to supplying tanks during World War II; and 18 19 WHEREAS, in 1942, Frank Lacy founded Lacy Manufacturing Corporation with businessman E.A. 20 "Mike" Sale by buying a few old sewing machines, renting space in the Martinsville Coca-Cola 21 building, producing zippered jackets, and learning the textile industry along the way; and 22 WHEREAS, in 1945, Frank Lacy expanded company production, adding men's swimwear and 23 moving the business to a building on Adele Street that once was a silk mill; and 24 WHEREAS, due to Frank Lacy's principled business practices and his consideration toward his 25 employees, the Lacy Manufacturing Corporation grew to become a leader in Martinsville's textile industry, increasing the number of swimwear lines and jobs and opening its Roy Street plant; and 26 27 WHEREAS, by 1970, Lacy Manufacturing Corporation employed 450 employees in the two plants, with sales exceeding \$6.5 million, and by 1980 sales topped \$12 million; and 28 WHEREAS, Frank Lacy and his wife Mary Lou Pannill Lacy, a daughter of William Letcher Pannill 29 30 of Pannill Knitting, sold controlling interest of the company to five company officers in 1975; and 31 WHEREAS, committed to improving the quality of life of his fellow citizens, Frank Lacy generously gave his time and talents to numerous civic organizations, serving as a board member of the Piedmont Trust Bank, as well as serving on the board of directors of Memorial Hospital of Martinsville and Henry 32 33 34 County and the Martinsville School Board, in both capacities for 14 years with eight of those years as 35 chairman: and 36 WHEREAS, Frank and Mary Lou Lacy established the Lacy Foundation, which supports humanitarian causes worldwide; local projects in Martinsville, Henry County, and neighboring 37 Winston-Salem, North Carolina; and specific organizations, including the YMCA, Piedmont Arts 38 39 Association, Adult Day Care, Salvation Army, MARC Workshop, Virginia Museum of Natural History, Citizens Against Family Violence, and Stepping Stones; and 40 41 WHEREAS, Frank Lacy was a faithful member of First Presbyterian Church, where he was an elder and headed the building committee when the new church was built on Patrick Henry Avenue; and 42 WHEREAS, Frank Lacy will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his family, his numerous 43 44 friends and admirers, and the citizens of Martinsville; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly mourn the passing of a generous community benefactor and outstanding Virginian, Frank McCormick Lacy; 45 46 47 and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for
presentation to the family of Frank McCormick Lacy as an expression of the General Assembly's respect
for his memory.
