**4. Title** Penalty for the sale or purchase of novelty cigarette lighters by underage individuals

**5. Summary/Purpose:**

This bill provides that any person who sells or distributes to, purchases for, or knowingly permits the purchase of any cigarette lighter that is not readily identifiable as such by any person less than 18 years of age, knowing or having reason to believe that the person is less than 18 years of age, is punishable by a civil penalty of no more than \$100. Likewise, any person less than 18 years of age who attempts to purchase a cigarette lighter that is not readily identifiable as such would receive a civil penalty of no more than \$100.
