4. Title Nursing Facility Quality Improvement Program

5. Summary/Purpose: The bill requires the Director of the Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) to establish a Nursing Facility Quality Improvement Program. This program replaces the role of nonprofit organizations to provide on-site training and assistance to promote quality care in nursing facilities. Funding for the program is from civil money penalties collected from nursing facilities. In addition, those funds may also be used for the costs of relocating residents to other facilities, maintenance of operation of a facility pending correction of deficiencies or closure, and reimbursement of residents for personal funds lost.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No. The fiscal impact is nongeneral fund, which can be handled administratively.

8. Fiscal implications: The bill has no fiscal impact to the general fund. It creates a program operated by DMAS to promote quality care in nursing facilities, which is funded from civil money penalties collected from nursing facilities. The agency receives an average of just over \$150,000 a year (based on the last three years) of revenue from those penalties. DMAS will need one staff person at a cost of \$51,600 to manage the program. This person would not be a classified employee.
