10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 54.1-2712 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 27 of Title 54.1 an article numbered 4, consisting of a
13	section numbered 54.1-2729.01, as follows:
13 14	§ 54.1-2712. Permissible practices.
15	The following activities shall be permissible:
16	1. Dental assistants or dental hygienists aiding or assisting licensed dentists, or dental assistants
17	aiding or assisting dental hygienists under the general supervision of a dentist in accordance with
18	regulations promulgated pursuant to § 54.1-2729.01;
19	2. The performance of mechanical work on inanimate objects only, for licensed dentists, by any
20	person employed in or operating a dental laboratory;
21	3. Dental students who are enrolled in accredited D.D.S. or D.M.D. degree programs performing
22	dental operations, under the direction of competent instructors (i) within a dental school or college,
23	dental department of a university or college, or other dental facility within a university or college that is
24	accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education; (ii) in a
25	dental clinic operated by a nonprofit organization providing indigent care; (iii) in governmental or
26	indigent care clinics in which the student is assigned to practice during his final academic year rotations;
27	(iv) in a private dental office for a limited time during the student's final academic year when under the
28	direct tutorial supervision of a licensed dentist holding appointment on the dental faculty of the school
29 30	in which the student is enrolled; or (v) practicing dental hygiene in a private dental office under the direct supervision of a licensed dentist holding appointment on the dental faculty of the school in which
30 31	the student is enrolled;
32	4. A licensed dentist from another state or country appearing as a clinician for demonstrating
33	technical procedures before a dental society or organization, convention, or dental college, or performing
34	his duties in connection with a specific case on which he may have been called to the Commonwealth;

36	5. Dental hygiene students enrolled in an accredited dental hygiene program performing dental
37	hygiene practices as a requisite of the program, under the direction of competent instructors, as defined
38	by regulations of the Board of Dentistry, (i) within a dental hygiene program in a dental school or
39	college, or department thereof, or other dental facility within a university or college that is accredited by
40	an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education; (ii) in a dental clinic
41	operated by a nonprofit organization providing indigent care; (iii) in a governmental or indigent care
42	clinic in which the student is assigned to practice during his final academic year rotations; or (iv) in a
43 44	private dental office for a limited time during the student's final academic year when under the direct supervision of a licensed dentist or licensed dental hygienist holding appointment on the dental faculty

47	Practice of Dental Assistants.
<b>48</b>	§ 54.1-2729.01. Practice of dental assistants.
49	A. A person who is employed to assist a licensed dentist or dental hygienist by performing duties not
50	otherwise restricted to the practice of a dentist, dental hygienist, or dental assistant II, as prescribed in
51	regulations promulgated by the Board may practice as a dental assistant I.
52	B. A person who (i) has met the educational and training requirements prescribed by the Board; (ii)
53	holds a certification from a credentialing organization recognized by the American Dental Association;
54	and (iii) has met any other qualifications for registration as prescribed in regulations promulgated by
55	the Board may practice as a dental assistant II. A dental assistant II may perform duties not otherwise
56	restricted to the practice of a dentist or dental hygienist under the direction of a licensed dentist that
57	are reversible, intraoral procedures specified in regulations promulgated by the Board.
