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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That §§ 24.2-947.4, 24.2-949.5, 24.2-949.9:2, 24.2-950.1, and 24.2-950.4 of the Code of Virginia
13	are amended and reenacted as follows:
14	§ 24.2-947.4. Information to be included on campaign finance reports for campaign committees.
15	A. The reports required by this article shall be filed on a form prescribed by the State Board and
16	shall include all financial activity of the campaign committee. All completed forms shall be submitted in
17 18	typed, printed, or legibly hand printed format or electronically as provided in § 24.2-946.1. Persons submitting the forms shall do so subject to felony penalties for making false statements pursuant to

20	B. The report of receipts shall include:

F. The State Board shall provide for a "no activity" report that may be filed for any reporting period 65 in which the filer has no activity to report. 66

G. It is the joint responsibility of the candidate and his treasurer that the report of a candidate be 67 filed, that the report be in full and accurate detail, and that the report be received by the State Board, 68 local electoral board, or both, by the deadline for filing the report. 69 70

§ 24.2-949.5. Information to be included on campaign finance reports for political action committees.

A. The reports required by this article shall be filed on a form prescribed by the State Board and 71 shall include all financial activity of the political action committee. All completed forms shall be 72 submitted in typed, printed, or legibly hand printed format or electronically as provided in § 24.2-946.1. 73 74 Persons submitting the forms shall do so subject to felony penalties for making false statements pursuant 75 to § 24.2-1016.

B. The report of receipts shall include:

77 1. The total number of contributors, each of whom has contributed an aggregate of \$100 or less, 78 including cash and in-kind contributions, as of the date of the report, and the total amount of 79 contributions from all such contributors;

80 2. For each contributor who has contributed an aggregate of more than \$100, including cash and in-kind contributions, as of the ending date of the report, the political action committee shall itemize 81 82 each contributor on the report and list the following information:

123 § 24.2-949.9:2. Out-of-state political committees; reporting requirements.

124 A. The provisions of this section are applicable only to out-of-state political committees.

125 B. After the committee has met the requirements of § 24.2-949.9:1 and upon making any contribution 126 to a candidate campaign committee or political committee registered in Virginia, the committee shall 127 report its contributions and contributors in accordance with subsection C to the State Board of Elections 128 by computer or electronic means as prescribed in § 24.2-946.1.

129 C. The report required by subsection B shall include (i) a report of the contributions the committee 130 has made to candidate campaign committees or political committees in the Commonwealth since the 131 filing of a report of its contributions pursuant to subsection D of § 24.2-949.9:1 or this subsection during 132 the period covered by the report and (ii) a list of each contributor who has contributed to the committee 133 \$2,500 or more in the aggregate since the filing of a list of its contributors pursuant to subsection D of 134 § 24.2-949.9:1 or this subsection with the contributor's name, address, occupation, employer, and place 135 of business and the dates and amounts of the contributor's contributions during the period covered by 136 the report.

137 D. The report of receipts shall also include each contribution received by the committee and 138 designated in writing, orally, or otherwise by the contributor for the election of a specified candidate or 139 candidates. Upon transfer of a designated contribution to a designated candidate's campaign committee, 140 the committee shall provide information to the campaign committee to identify the contributor as 141 provided by § 24.2-947.4.

142 DE. The reporting requirements of this section shall continue in effect for each committee until a 143 final report is filed that sets forth all contributions and expenditures not previously reported. The final 144 report shall include a termination statement, signed by an officer of the committee, that all reporting is 145 complete and final. 146

§ 24.2-950.1. Certain political party committees exempt.

147 A. Except as provided in subsections ubsections B and C of this section, and subsection D of 148 § 24.2-947.3, and § 24.2-950.5, any local district, county, or city party committee shall be exempt from 149 the reporting requirements of this chapter. Contributions made by such committee to any candidate, his 150 campaign committee, or a political committee shall be reported by the recipient of the contribution in 151 accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

152 B. The exemption provided in this section shall not be applicable to state political party committees, 153 congressional district political party committees, or county or city political party committees for any 154 county or city with a population of more than 100,000, or organized political party groups of elected 155 officials. Any other political party committee shall be exempt from the reporting and notification 156 requirements of this chapter, except as provided in §§ 24.2-945.2 and 24.2-950.5, in each calendar year 157 in which it does not accept contributions totaling more than \$15,000, or make contributions and 158 expenditures totaling more than \$15,000. Any such committee shall be subject to such reporting 159 requirements as soon as it accepts aggregated contributions, or makes aggregated contributions and expenditures, in excess of \$15,000 in a calendar year. The first report filed pursuant to \$ 24.2-950.6 160 161 shall account for all receipts and disbursements during the calendar year and shall be complete through 162 the completion date for the report period.

163 C. Each local district, county, or city political party committee shall comply with the provisions of 164 subdivision B 1 of § 24.2-950.4 and report the receipt and disbursement of contributions received by it 165 and designated by the contributor for a specified candidate or candidates. 166

§ 24.2-950.4. Information to be included on campaign finance reports for political party committees.

167 A. The reports required by this article shall be filed on a form prescribed by the State Board and 168 shall include all financial activity of the political party committee. All completed forms shall be submitted in typed, printed, or legibly hand printed format or electronically as provided in § 24.2-946.1. 169 170 Persons submitting the forms shall do so subject to felony penalties for making false statements pursuant 171 to § 24.2-1016. 172
