Recognizing the historic value and importance of the last known wild herd of Spanish mustangs.

9 WHEREAS, on the barrier islands of Virginia and North Carolina, there exists a herd of wild horses
10 that are the last known herd of Spanish mustangs existing in a natural state and whose presence predates
11 English settlement in North America; and

12 WHEREAS, in 1926, a reporter for *National Geographic* magazine noted that more than 5,000 wild 13 horses roamed the coasts of Virginia and North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the Outer Banks north of Corolla and south of the Virginia state line hasbeen designated as a wild horse sanctuary; and

WHEREAS, horses leaving the wild horse sanctuary risk entering Virginia and being killed on theroadways and entering populated areas near Virginia Beach; and

18 WHEREAS, the Commonwealth must protect the presence of this important cultural and historical19 resource in Virginia, which is an emblem of our national heritage; and

20 WHEREAS, there is a need for funds for the construction of fences to contain the horses safely in

the wild horse sanctuary, for assisting community groups willing to return horses to the sanctuary from populated areas in Virginia, and for paying for the medical care needed by horses injured on Virginia

roadways; now, therefore, be it
