WHEREAS, Hunter Walker was thrilled to receive the medal and a framed certificate at the annual Boy Scouts of America's recognition banquet held in Fishersville; and

WHEREAS, along with a group of Eagle Scouts at the recognition ceremony, Hunter Walker was the only Cub Scout to receive an award, and the only Scout honored with the Medal of Merit, a prestigious award that few Scouts receive; and

WHEREAS, Hunter Walker's proud parents are Amy and Matt Walker and his equally proud Scout Leader is Dean Ostrowski; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly commend and congratulate Hunter Walker as the recipient of the Medal of Merit, the highest award given by the Boy Scouts of America; and, be it
