WHEREAS, on November 3, 2007, the Vienna Police Department celebrated its 60th anniversary of outstanding and exemplary service to the residents of the Town of Vienna; and

WHEREAS, since its founding in 1947, the Vienna Police Department has undergone tremendous change; the Vienna Town Council voted to expand the department from a one-man town sergeant to a two-man police department and purchased its first official police cruiser; and

WHEREAS, with the assistance of the Vienna Auxiliary Police, comprised of nonpaid volunteer citizens, the Vienna Police Department is able to maximize the availability of its regular police officers to the community; and

WHEREAS, the Police Chief's Advisory Council was formed in January 1993 to enhance the relationship between the police department and the community by furthering the exchange of information and ideas, while working to improve law-enforcement procedures; and

WHEREAS, the Vienna Police Department is dedicated to providing the community with the highest quality service possible in a prompt, courteous, and professional manner; and

WHEREAS, the outstanding and dedicated officers and staff of the Vienna Police Department take great pride in their 60-year history of successful community partnership and problem-oriented policing; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly commend and congratulate the Vienna Police Department on the occasion of its 60th anniversary; and, be it
