WHEREAS, George Brown served in the United States Army for three years during World War II, rose to the rank of staff sergeant and fought in five major battles; he earned several medals for his distinguished service and dedication to the mission; and

WHEREAS, an active member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 7167, George Brown was well-known throughout the community for his dedication to serving and protecting others; and

WHEREAS, George Brown was a member of Warsaw Methodist Church, where he gathered with friends and family in faith; and

WHEREAS, George Brown will be remembered fondly by his family and friends and deeply missed by his beloved wife of 62 years, Ruth; his sons, Wayne and Gary; his daughter, Gloria; and his six grandchildren; now, therefore, be it
