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# VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact §§ 37.2-304 and 51.5-14 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code 3 of Virginia by adding a section numbered 2.2-2001.1, relating to the Department of Veterans 4 Services; mental health and rehabilitation program for veterans.

### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That §§ 37.2-304 and 51.5-14 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the 9 Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 2.2-2001.1 as follows:

10 § 2.2-2001.1. Program for mental health and rehabilitative services.

11 The Department, in cooperation with the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and 12 Substance Abuse Services and the Department of Rehabilitative Services, shall establish a program to 13 monitor and coordinate mental health and rehabilitative services support for Virginia veterans and members of the Virginia National Guard and Virginia residents in the Armed Forces Reserves not in 14 15 active federal service. The program shall also support family members affected by covered military members' service and deployments. The purpose of the program is to ensure that adequate and timely 16 17 assessment, treatment, and support are available to veterans, service members, and affected family 18 members.

19 The program shall facilitate support for covered individuals to provide timely assessment and 20 treatment for stress-related injuries and traumatic brain injuries resulting from service in combat areas, 21 and subject to the availability of public and private funds appropriated for them, case management 22 services, outpatient, family support, and other appropriate behavioral health and brain injury services 23 necessary to provide individual services and support to military service members and their family 24 members covered by this section. 25

§ 37.2-304. Duties of Commissioner.

26 The Commissioner shall be the chief executive officer of the Department and shall have the 27 following duties and powers:

1. To supervise and manage the Department and its state facilities. 28

29 2. To employ the personnel required to carry out the purposes of this title.

30 3. To make and enter into all contracts and agreements necessary or incidental to the performance of 31 the Department's duties and the execution of its powers under this title, including contracts with the United States, other states, and agencies and governmental subdivisions of the Commonwealth, 32 consistent with policies and regulations of the Board and applicable federal and state statutes and 33 34 regulations.

4. To accept, hold, and enjoy gifts, donations, and bequests on behalf of the Department from the 35 36 United States government, agencies and instrumentalities thereof, and any other source, subject to the 37 approval of the Governor. To these ends, the Commissioner shall have the power to comply with 38 conditions and execute agreements that may be necessary, convenient, or desirable, consistent with 39 policies and regulations of the Board.

40 5. To accept, execute, and administer any trust in which the Department may have an interest, under 41 the terms of the instruments creating the trust, subject to the approval of the Governor.

42 6. To transfer between state hospitals and training centers school-age consumers who have been 43 identified as appropriate to be placed in public school programs and to negotiate with other school divisions for placements in order to ameliorate the impact on those school divisions located in a 44 45 jurisdiction in which a state hospital or training center is located.

7. To provide to the Director of the Virginia Office for Protection and Advocacy, pursuant to 46 47 § 51.5-39.12, a written report setting forth the known facts of critical incidents or deaths of consumers in facilities within 15 working days of the critical incident or death. 48

49 8. To work with the appropriate state and federal entities to ensure that any person who has been a 50 consumer in a state facility for more than one year has possession of or receives prior to discharge any of the following documents, when they are needed to obtain the services contained in his discharge plan: 51 a Department of Motor Vehicles approved identification card that will expire 90 days from issuance, a 52 53 copy of his birth certificate if the consumer was born in the Commonwealth, or a social security card 54 from the Social Security Administration. State facility directors, as part of their responsibilities pursuant 55 to § 37.2-837, shall implement this provision when discharging consumers.

56 9. To work with the Department of Veterans Services and the Department of Rehabilitative Services SB297ER

57 to establish a program for mental health and rehabilitative services for Virginia veterans and members 58 of the Virginia National Guard and Virginia residents in the Armed Forces Reserves not in active 59 federal service and their family members pursuant to § 2.2-2001.1.

60 Unless specifically authorized by the Governor to accept or undertake activities for compensation, the 61 Commissioner shall devote his entire time to his duties.

62 § 51.5-14. Powers and duties of Commissioner. 63

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The Commissioner shall have the following powers and duties:

1. To employ such personnel, qualified by knowledge, skills, and abilities, as may be required to 64 carry out the purposes of this title relating to the Department; 65

66 2. To make and enter into all contracts and agreements necessary or incidental to the performance of 67 the Department's duties and the execution of its powers under this title, including, but not limited to, contracts with the United States, other states, agencies and governmental subdivisions of this 68 69 Commonwealth;

70 3. To accept grants from the United States government and agencies and instrumentalities thereof and 71 any other source and, to these ends, to comply with such conditions and execute such agreements as 72 may be necessary, convenient or desirable; 73

4. To do all acts necessary or convenient to carry out the purposes of this title;

5. To develop and analyze information on the needs of persons with disabilities;

75 6. To establish plans, policies and programs for the delivery of services to persons with disabilities for consideration by the Governor and the General Assembly. Such policies, plans and programs for 76 77 services to those who cannot benefit from vocational rehabilitation shall be prepared over time, and as 78 funds become available for such efforts;

79 7. To operate and maintain the Woodrow Wilson Rehabilitation Center and to organize, supervise 80 and provide other necessary services and facilities (i) to prepare persons with disabilities for useful and productive lives, including suitable employment and (ii) to enable persons with disabilities, to the degree 81 possible, to become self-sufficient and have a sense of well-being; 82

83 8. To develop criteria for the evaluation of plans and programs relative to the provision of 84 rehabilitative and other services;

85 9. To investigate the availability of funds from any source for planning, developing and providing services to persons with disabilities, particularly those not capable of being gainfully employed; 86

10. To coordinate the Department's plans, policies, programs and services, and such programs and 87 88 services required under § 51.5-9.2, with those of the other state agencies providing services to persons 89 with disabilities so as to achieve maximum utilization of available resources to meet the needs of such 90 persons;

91 11. To compile and provide information on the availability of federal, state, regional and local funds 92 and services for persons with disabilities;

93 12. To accept, execute and administer any trust in which the Department may have an interest, under 94 the terms of the instruments creating the trust, subject to the approval of the Governor;

13. To promulgate regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of the laws of the Commonwealth administered by the Department; and 95 96

97 14. To work with the Department of Veterans Services and the Department of Mental Health, Mental 98 Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to establish a program for mental health and rehabilitative 99 services for Virginia veterans and members of the Virginia National Guard and Virginia residents in the Armed Forces Reserves not in active federal service and their family members pursuant to § 2.2-2001.1; 100 101 and

102 15. To perform such other duties as may be required by the Governor and the Secretary of Health 103 and Human Resources.

104 That the Commissioner of the Department of Veterans Services shall (i) actively pursue all 2. 105 means available to secure federal funding for the program established by this act, including federal grants and earmarked funds and (ii) ensure the maximization of federal and private funds 106 to support the program. Additionally, the Veterans Services Foundation shall support the program 107 108 established by this act as a top priority of its fundraising efforts.
