That §§ 2.2-1401, 2.2-1403 and 2.2-4310 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 11 12 follows: 13 § 2.2-1401. Definitions. 14 As used in this chapter unless the context requires a different meaning: "Certification" means the process by which a business is determined to be a sheltered workshop or a 15 16 small, women- or minority-owned business for the purpose of reporting sheltered workshop or small, women-owned, and minority-owned business participation in state contracts and purchases pursuant to 17 §§ 2.2-1404 and 2.2-1405. 18 19 "Disadvantaged business enterprise" means a small business concern, as defined in 49 CFR Parts 23 20 and 26, that is at least 51% owned by one or more socially and economically disadvantaged individuals, 21 or, in the case of any corporation, partnership, or limited liability company or other entity, at least 51% 22 of the equity ownership is owned by one or more socially and economically disadvantaged individuals 23 and the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more of the socially and 24 economically disadvantaged individuals who own it. 25 "Minority individual" means an individual who is a citizen of the United States or a non-citizen who 26 is in full compliance with United States immigration law and who satisfies one or more of the following 27 definitions: 28 1. "African American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Africa and 29 who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part. 30 2. "Asian American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, 31 Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands, including but not limited to Japan, China, Vietnam, Samoa, Laos, Cambodia, Taiwan, Northern Mariana, the Philippines, a U.S. territory of the 32 33 Pacific, India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, or Sri Lanka and who is regarded as such by the community of 34 which this person claims to be a part. 35 3. "Hispanic American" means a person having origins in any of the Spanish-speaking peoples of 36 Mexico, South or Central America, or the Caribbean Islands or other Spanish or Portuguese cultures and 37 who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part. 38 4. "Native American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America 39 and who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part or who is 40 recognized by a tribal organization. 41 "Minority-owned business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or more minority individuals or in the case of a corporation, partnership, or limited liability company or other 42 43 entity, at least 51% of the equity ownership interest in the corporation, partnership, or limited liability company or other entity is owned by one or more minority individuals and both the management and 44 45 daily business operations are controlled by one or more minority individuals. 'Sheltered workshop" means a nonprofit business entity or organization that offers transitional or 46 47 supported employment services serving the disabled. 'Small business" means an independently owned and operated business which, together with 48 49 affiliates, has 250 or fewer employees, or average annual gross receipts of \$10 million or less averaged 50 over the previous three years. 51 "State agency" means any authority, board, department, instrumentality, institution, agency, or other 52 unit of state government. "State agency" shall not include any county, city, or town. "Women-owned business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or more 53 women who are U.S. citizens or legal resident aliens, or in the case of a corporation, partnership, or 54 55 limited liability company or other entity, at least 51% of the equity ownership interest is owned by one or more women who are citizens of the United States or non-citizens who are in full compliance with 56 the United States immigration law, and both the management and daily business operations are 57

58 controlled by one or more women who are U.S. citizens or legal resident aliens.

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59 § 2.2-1403. Powers of Director.

60 As deemed necessary or appropriate to better fulfill the duties of the Department, the Director may:

1. With the participation of other state departments and agencies, develop comprehensive plans and 61 62 specific program goals for the small, women- and minority-owned business programs and sheltered 63 workshops; establish regular performance monitoring and reporting systems to assure that goals of state 64 agencies and institutions are being achieved; and evaluate the impact of federal and state support in 65 achieving objectives.

66 2. Employ the necessary personnel and/or subcontract according to his discretion, with localities to supplement the functions of business development organizations. 67

3. Assure the coordinated review of all proposed state training and technical assistance activities in direct support of the small, women- and minority-owned business programs and sheltered workshops to 68 69 70 ensure consistency with program goals and to avoid duplication.

71 4. Convene, for purposes of coordination, meetings of the heads of departments and agencies, or their designees, whose programs and activities may affect or contribute to the purposes of this chapter. 72

5. Convene business leaders, educators, and other representatives of the private sector who are 73 engaged in assisting the development of small, women- and minority-owned business programs or who 74 75 could contribute to its development, for the purpose of proposing, evaluating or coordinating governmental and private activities in furtherance of the objectives of this chapter. 76

77 6. Provide the managerial and organizational framework through which joint undertakings with state 78 departments or agencies or private organizations can be planned and implemented. 79

7. Recommend appropriate legislative or executive actions.

80 8. Adopt regulations to implement certification programs for small, women- and minority-owned businesses and sheltered workshops, which regulations shall be exempt from the Administrative Process 81 Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) pursuant to subdivision B 2 of § 2.2-4002. Such certification programs shall 82 83 deny certification to vendors from states that deny like certifications to Virginia-based small, women- or minority-owned businesses and sheltered workshops or that provide a preference for small, women- or 84 minority-owned businesses and sheltered workshops based in that state that is not available to 85 Virginia-based businesses. The regulations shall (i) establish minimum requirements for certification of 86 87 small, women- and minority-owned businesses and sheltered workshops; (ii) provide a process for 88 evaluating existing local, state, private sector, and federal certification programs that meet the minimum 89 requirements; and (iii) mandate certification, without any additional paperwork or fee, of any prospective 90 state vendor that has obtained certification under any certification program that is determined to meet the 91 minimum requirements established in the regulations.

92 9. Establish an interdepartmental board in accordance with § 2.2-1404 to supply the Director with 93 information useful in promoting minority business activity.

94 § 2.2-4310. Discrimination prohibited; participation of small, women-, minority- and service disabled 95 veteran-owned business.

96 A. In the solicitation or awarding of contracts, no public body shall discriminate against a bidder or 97 offeror because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, status as a service disabled 98 veteran, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment. Whenever 99 solicitations are made, each public body shall include businesses selected from a list made available by 100 the Department of Minority Business Enterprise.

101 B. All public bodies shall establish programs consistent with this chapter to facilitate the participation 102 of sheltered workshops, small businesses and businesses owned by women, minorities, and service disabled veterans in procurement transactions. The programs established shall be in writing and shall 103 comply with the provisions of any enhancement or remedial measures authorized by the Governor 104 pursuant to subsection C or, where applicable, by the chief executive of a local governing body pursuant 105 to § 15.2-965.1, and shall include specific plans to achieve any goals established therein. State agencies 106 107 shall submit annual progress reports on small, women- and minority-owned business procurement and on 108 service disabled veteran-owned business and sheltered workshop procurement to the Department of Minority Business Enterprise in a form specified by the Department of Minority Business Enterprise. 109 The Department of Minority Business Enterprise shall make information on service disabled 110 veteran-owned procurement available to the Department of Veterans Services upon request. 111

C. Whenever there exists (i) a rational basis for small business enhancement or (ii) a persuasive 112 113 analysis that documents a statistically significant disparity between the availability and utilization of women- and minority-owned businesses, the Governor is authorized and encouraged to require state 114 115 agencies to implement appropriate enhancement or remedial measures consistent with prevailing law.

116 D. In the solicitation or awarding of contracts, no state agency, department or institution shall discriminate against a bidder or offeror because the bidder or offeror employs ex-offenders unless the 117 118 state agency, department or institution has made a written determination that employing ex-offenders on 119 the specific contract is not in its best interest.

120 E. As used in this section: "Minority individual" means an individual who is a citizen of the United States or a non-citizen who
 is in full compliance with United States immigration law and who satisfies one or more of the following
 definitions:

124 1. "African American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Africa and 125 who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part.

2. "Asian American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East,
Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands, including but not limited to Japan, China,
Vietnam, Samoa, Laos, Cambodia, Taiwan, Northern Mariana, the Philippines, a U.S. territory of the
Pacific, India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, or Sri Lanka and who is regarded as such by the community of
which this person claims to be a part.

3. "Hispanic American" means a person having origins in any of the Spanish-speaking peoples of
 Mexico, South or Central America, or the Caribbean Islands or other Spanish or Portuguese cultures and
 who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part.

4. "Native American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part or who is recognized by a tribal organization.

"Minority-owned business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or more minority individuals or in the case of a corporation, partnership, or limited liability company or other entity, at least 51% of the equity ownership interest in the corporation, partnership, or limited liability company or other entity is owned by one or more minority individuals and both the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more minority individuals.

142 "Service disabled veteran" means a veteran who (i) served on active duty in the United States
143 military ground, naval, or air service, (ii) was discharged or released under conditions other than
144 dishonorable, and (iii) has a service-connected disability rating fixed by the United States Veterans
145 Administration of (a) 50% or greater or (b) 10% or greater if the service-connected disability is combat
146 related.

"Service disabled veteran business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or
more service disabled veterans or, in the case of a corporation, partnership, or limited liability company
or other entity, at least 51% of the equity ownership interest in the corporation, partnership, or limited
liability company or other entity is owned by one or more individuals who are service disabled veterans
and both the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more individuals who
are service disabled veterans.

"Sheltered workshop" means a nonprofit business entity or organization that offers transitional or
 supported employment services serving the disabled.

155 "Small business" means an independently owned and operated business which, together with
156 affiliates, has 250 or fewer employees, or average annual gross receipts of \$10 million or less averaged
157 over the previous three years.

158 "State agency" means any authority, board, department, instrumentality, institution, agency, or other
159 unit of state government. "State agency" shall not include any county, city, or town.
160 "Women-owned business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or more

160 "Women-owned business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or more 161 women who are citizens of the United States or non-citizens who are in full compliance with United 162 States immigration law, or in the case of a corporation, partnership, or limited liability company or other 163 entity, at least 51% of the equity ownership interest is owned by one or more women who are citizens 164 of the United States or non-citizens who are in full compliance with United States immigration law, and 165 both the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more women who are 166 citizens of the United States or non-citizens who are in full compliance with United States immigration 167 law.

168 2. That the Director of the Department of Minority Business Enterprise shall promulgate 169 regulations to implement the provisions of this act, including the criteria for the certification of 170 sheltered workshops, to be effective within 280 days of its enactment.
