## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY — CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 18.2-248.03, relating to manufacturing, selling, giving, distributing of methamphetamine; penalty.

# 6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-248.03 as follows:

8 § 18.2-248.03. Manufacturing, selling, giving, distributing, or possessing with intent to manufacture,
 9 sell, give, or distribute methamphetamine; penalty.

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person who manufactures, sells, gives, distributes,
or possesses with intent to manufacture, sell, give, or distribute 28 grams or more of a mixture or
substance containing a detectable amount of methamphetamine, its salts, isomers, or salts of its isomers
is guilty of a felony punishable by a fine of not more than \$500,000 and imprisonment for not less than
five nor more than 40 years, three years of which shall be a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment
to be served consecutively with any other sentence.

B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person who manufactures, sells, gives, distributes,
or possesses with intent to manufacture, sell, give, or distribute 227 grams or more of a mixture or
substance containing a detectable amount of methamphetamine, its salts, isomers, or salts of its isomers
is guilty of a felony punishable by a fine of not more than \$1 million and imprisonment for not less than
five years nor more than life, five years of which shall be a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment

21 to be served consecutively with any other sentence.

22 2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or 23 commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation is 24 \$260,310 for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities and cannot be 25 determined for periods of commitment to the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice.
