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10	WHEREAS, according to Forbes magazine, the business-friendly policies promoted by government
11	leaders have made the Commonwealth the number one ranked state for business two years in a row; and
12	WHEREAS, while the Commonwealth continues to support business-friendly policies, we recognize
13	the need to also champion new technology and knowledge-based economic development strategies that
14	prepare the Commonwealth for global competition and ensure that the existing technology industry
15	continues to thrive; and
16	WHEREAS, while Virginia has the highest concentration of technology workers in the nation, it lags
17	in both entrepreneurial endeavors and the creation of intellectual property, both of which are indicators
18	for the creation of the next generation of technology companies; and
19	WHEREAS, recent recommendations and proposals to address innovation challenges in the
20	Commonwealth have been introduced by numerous organizations and agencies; now, therefore, be it
21	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Center for Innovative
22	Technology (CIT) be requested to establish a Commonwealth Innovation Index to foster the formation,
23	retention, and expansion of technology-based economic development opportunities. In developing the
24	Innovation Index, CIT shall solicit input from the Commonwealth's regional technology councils and
25	technology community. The index shall serve as a community-driven tool that will enable community
26	and Commonwealth leaders to steer a successful course toward global leadership in advanced technology
27	company formation and attraction while saving tax dollars.
28	The Center for Innovative Technology shall report to the Joint Commission on Technology and
29	Science on its progress by October 1, 2008, and submit to the Division of Legislative Automated
30	Systems an executive summary and report of its progress in meeting the requests of this resolution no
31	later than the first day of the 2009 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary
$\overline{32}$	and report shall be submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the
33	Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and
34	shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

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
