4. Title: Judicial retirement.

5. Summary: Judicial retirement. House Bill 411 would allow a judge who is a member of the Judicial Retirement System who is at least age 50 and has 20 or more years of service on or before July 1, 2008 to retire with an unreduced retirement benefit. The years of service are to be calculated without the weighted years of service and cannot include prior service under the Virginia Retirement System, the State Police Officers' Retirement System, the Virginia Law Officers' Retirement System, or purchased service.
