- **5. Summary:** Provides that a health care entities shall disclose records to independent examiners conducting examinations of a person who is the subject of an involuntary commitment order. This bill also clarifies that a person who is subject to a temporary detention order shall be given a thorough psychological evaluation, including a substance abuse screening and that the independent evaluator shall review the person's medical records including records of any previous psychological evaluations, prior to conducting the evaluation.

- 7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No
- **8**. **Fiscal Implications:** The bill provides technical clarifications regarding the evaluation procedure. This could increase the amount of time that examiners need to carry out evaluations, however currently they are reimbursed at a rate of \$75 by the Court. If the examination process becomes burdensome, examiners may insist on an increase in the reimbursement rate.
