5.	<b>Summary:</b> The substitute bill contains numerous technical amendments and adds Title 32.1, a chapter numbered 16, which relates to smoking in restaurants and civil penalties. The bill also adds a prohibition against smoking in any food establishment in the Commonwealth and provides heightened penalties for violation.

The number of offenders of the Act is unknown; therefore, the amount of revenue collected from civil penalties cannot be determined. Any revenue collected from the civil penalties will be deposited into the Virginia Health Care Fund.
