## 4. Title: Virginia Highway Corporation Act of 1988; tolls on the Dulles Greenway.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation would authorize the State Corporation Commission (SCC) to take certain actions during any toll rate case under the Virginia Highway Corporation Act of 1988. The SCC is authorized to exclude from the accounts of the operator any payment to an affiliated interest for any services rendered or property or service furnished, if it is not consistent with the public interest.

In addition, if there is a change in the ownership of an operator or the issuance of securities, the SCC, in any subsequent toll rate proceeding, shall ensure that any costs attributable to or resulting from the change in ownership or issuance of securities that would contribute to an increase in the level of the toll are excluded from the operator's reasonable return.

The bill also requires the operator to provide copies of annual audited financial statements. The proposed legislation requests the Office of the Attorney General to report to the General Assembly findings from an independent financial review of the operator and any recommendations of amendments to the Virginia Highway Corporation Act of 1988.

The only toll road constructed pursuant to the provisions of the Virginia Highway Corporation Act of 1988 is the Dulles Greenway, located in Loudoun County.

- 8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed legislation would give the SCC more authority to review the financial statements of toll road operators during a toll rate proceeding. The SCC is to ensure that certain expenditures of the operator are not included in the calculations determining the toll rate adjustment and the operator's reasonable rate of return, as well as reviewing that payments and compensation to an affiliated interest are consistent with the public interest. The State Corporation Commission does not anticipate any additional staffing will be required to address the requirements of this legislation.
