Unsolicited proposals to add capacity to Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel to be accepted by 11 Virginia Department of Transportation; procedure. 12 A. The Virginia Department of Transportation is hereby directed to accept unsolicited proposals 13 under the Public-Private Transportation Act of 1995 (§ 56-556 et seq.) to add physical capacity to the 14 15 Interstate 64 Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel between Hampton and Norfolk. Unsolicited proposals shall 16 be filed with the Department no later than September 30, 2009. B. Upon enactment of this act, the Department shall make available on its website the following: (i) 17 any and all information about the existing Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel, including traffic counts, 18 maintenance records, and current plans and specifications; and (ii) any and all information, studies, and 19 20 reports analyzing potential scenarios for the physical expansion of the Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel. 21 The Department may take such measures as necessary to protect confidential information or to protect 22 vital state and national security interests that may be contained in such information. 23 C. Unsolicited proposals filed pursuant to this act shall provide information regarding team 24 qualifications and experience, project structure, a schedule for project development, the proposed cost 25 and outline public benefits of the project. The Department shall develop a process that would permit a private entity that is part of a proposal team to assist with the development of state or federally 26 27 mandated environmental reviews or permits required to complete the project. Completion of such 28 reviews or permits shall not be necessary prior to a decision by the Department to advance 29 consideration of conceptual proposals. 30 D. Within 60 days of the receipt of unsolicited proposals, and following an internal analysis of the 31 proposals to determine the financial and technical merit of the proposals and the proposal teams, the Department shall make a recommendation to the Commonwealth Transportation Board to advance no 32 33 more than two proposals to an Initial Review Panel. The Panel, which shall be appointed by the 34 Secretary of Transportation, shall afford opportunities for public comment on the proposals and provide 35 additional review and analysis of the remaining proposals. 36 E. No later than March 31, 2010, the Department shall make a recommendation to the 37 Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner to execute an interim agreement to continue design, 38 environmental reviews, and preliminary right-of-way acquisitions and to take any other steps necessary 39 to advance the development of the project. Moneys in the Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund 40 may be made available to carry out the provisions of the interim agreement. The interim agreement 41 shall also provide a schedule for the completion of the necessary reviews and approvals for construction 42 of the project. 2. The Virginia Department of Transportation shall promptly inform the Joint Commission on 43 Transportation Accountability, as authorized by Chapter 43 (§ 30-282 et seq.) of Title 30 of the 44 Code of Virginia, by written update, of its completion of each requirement of this act. 45

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
