093129720 **HOUSE BILL NO. 2669** 1 2 Offered January 23, 2009 3 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 3.2-6558, 3.2-6559, and 3.2-6560 of the Code of Virginia, relating to 4 humane investigators. 5 Patron—Scott, J.M. 6 7 Referred to Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources 8 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That §§ 3.2-6558, 3.2-6559, and 3.2-6560 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 10 11 follows: 12 § 3.2-6558. Humane investigators; qualifications; appointment; term. 13 A. A circuit court may reappoint appoint any person as a humane investigator for any locality within 14 its jurisdiction if the person: 1. Was appointed as a humane investigator prior to July 1, 2003; and 15 2. Has never been convicted of animal cruelty or neglect, any felony, or any crime of moral 16 turpitude according to a criminal background check, which shall be performed by the attorney for the 17 Commonwealth at the expense of the person seeking the appointment. 18 B. A circuit court may appoint a person to fill a vacancy in that jurisdiction created when a humane 19 20 investigator who was appointed prior to July 1, 2003, is no longer willing or eligible to be a humane 21 investigator, provided the person seeking appointment: 22 1. Has received a written recommendation from: (i) the administrative entity that oversees animal 23 control in the locality where the humane investigator seeks appointment or (ii) a releasing agency in the 24 locality where the humane investigator seeks appointment; 25 2. Has never been convicted of animal cruelty or neglect, any felony, or any crime of moral 26 turpitude according to a criminal background check, which shall be performed by the attorney for the 27 Commonwealth at the expense of the person seeking the appointment; and 28 3. Has completed a basic animal control course approved by the State Veterinarian pursuant to 29 § 3.2-6556. 30 C. A person residing outside the Commonwealth may be appointed as a humane investigator only if 31 he is employed by a humane society located within the locality where he is seeking appointment. 32 **D.** Reappointments 33 B. The administrative entity that oversees animal control in the locality where any humane 34 investigator has been appointed shall maintain and annually update a list of persons eligible for 35 appointment as humane investigators. 36 C. Appointments of humane investigators shall be for terms of three years. Any humane investigator 37 may be reappointed. Each humane investigator shall, during each term for which he is appointed, 38 complete 15 hours of training in animal care and protection approved for animal control officers. If a 39 humane investigator is appointed to a succeeding term before or within 30 days after his current term 40 expires, a criminal background check shall not be required. HThe circuit court that appointed a humane 41 investigator shall notify the administrative entity that oversees animal control in the locality where the humane investigator serves if a humane investigator's term expires and he is not appointed to a 42 succeeding term before or within 30 days after his current term expires, the humane investigator shall 43 44 not be appointed to another term. 45 § 3.2-6559. Powers and duties of humane investigators. A. Any humane investigator may, within the locality where he has been appointed, investigate 46 47 violations of laws and ordinances regarding care and treatment of animals and disposal of dead animals. B. Each humane investigator shall carry during the performance of his powers and duties under this 48 49 chapter an identification card issued by the locality where the humane investigator is appointed. The identification card shall include the following information regarding the humane investigator: 50 51 1. His full name; 52 2. The locality where he has been appointed; 53 3. The name of the circuit court that appointed him; 4. The signature of the circuit court judge that appointed him; 54 55 5. A photograph of his face; and 6. The date of expiration of his appointment. 56 C. Each humane investigator shall record on a form approved by the administrative entity that 57 58 oversees animal control every investigation he performs, maintain such record for five years, and make

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such record available upon request to any law-enforcement officer, animal control officer or State
Veterinarian's representative. Each humane investigator shall file quarterly a report summarizing such
records with the administrative agency that oversees animal control on an approved form. A humane
investigator's appointment may be revoked as provided in § 3.2-6561 if he fails to file such report.

63 D. Humane investigators shall be supervised by the same administrative entity that oversees animal 64 control in that locality.

§ 3.2-6560. Expenses of humane investigators.

Neither the appointment of any humane investigator, nor the performance of any service or duty by
him, shall require any locality or the Commonwealth to pay any cost or expense incurred by or on
behalf of a humane investigator. Any locality may reimburse any humane investigator appointed for that
locality for *training and* reasonable expenses incurred as the result of a specific request for services
from the locality.
