10	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, a majority of the members elected to
11	each house agreeing, That the following amendment to the Constitution of Virginia be, and the same
12	hereby is, proposed and referred to the General Assembly at its first regular session held after the next
13	general election of members of the House of Delegates for its concurrence in conformity with the
14 15	provisions of Section 1 of Article XII of the Constitution of Virginia, namely: Amend Section 6 of Article IV of the Constitution of Virginia as follows:
16	ARTICLE IV
1 7	LEGISLATURE
18	Section 6. Legislative sessions.
19	The General Assembly shall meet once each year on the second Wednesday in January. Except as
20 21	herein provided for reconvened sessions, no regular session of the General Assembly convened in an even-numbered year shall continue longer than sixty days; no regular session of the General Assembly
21	convened in an odd-numbered year shall continue longer than thirty days; but with the concurrence of
23	two-thirds of the members elected to each house, any regular session may be extended for a period not
24	exceeding thirty days. Neither house shall, without the consent of the other, adjourn to another place,
25	nor for more than three days.
26 27	The Governor may convene a special session of the General Assembly when, in his opinion, the
27 28	interest of the Commonwealth may require and shall convene a special session upon the application of two-thirds of the members elected to each house.
2 9	The General Assembly shall reconvene on the sixth Wednesday after adjournment of each regular or
30	special session for the purpose of considering bills which may have been returned by the Governor with
31	recommendations for their amendment and bills and items of appropriation bills which may have been
32	returned by the Governor with his objections. No other business shall be considered at a reconvened
33 34	session. Such reconvened session shall not continue longer than three days unless the session be extended, for a period not exceeding seven additional days, upon the vote of the majority of the
34	members elected to each house. The General Assembly may provide, by a joint resolution approved
36	during a regular or special session by the vote of the majority of the members elected to each house,
37	that it shall reconvene on a date after the sixth Wednesday after adjournment of the regular or special
38	session but no later than the seventh Wednesday after adjournment.
