3 Celebrating the life of Richard Bryant Anthony, Sr. 4

5 6 WHEREAS, Richard Bryant Anthony, Sr., of Richmond, a beloved educator and community 7 volunteer, died on January 24, 2009; and

8 WHEREAS, a native of North Carolina, Richard Anthony grew up in Wilson, North Carolina, 9 proudly served in the United States Coast Guard, and received a bachelor's degree in industrial arts from East Carolina College, now East Carolina University; and 10

WHEREAS, after graduation, Richard Anthony received 26 job offers and chose to come to Henrico 11 County as an industrial arts teacher at Douglas S. Freeman High School; and 12

13 WHEREAS, a dedicated and beloved educator, Richard Anthony, known for his "board of education" in his shop classes, taught industrial arts at Douglas Freeman High School from 1958 to 1973 and 14 15 served as principal from 1973 to 1986; and

WHEREAS, Richard Anthony, "gray and blue through and through," loved his work and considered 16 the students, faculty, and staff of Douglas Freeman High School as extended family and spent countless 17 hours at after-school activities and events in addition to serving as a volunteer firefighter with Henrico 18 19 County Station 8; and

20 WHEREAS, in 1986 Richard Anthony was transferred from Douglas Freeman High School to serve 21 as the administrator of a new vocational-educational foundation for Henrico County despite the 22 opposition of several hundred students from Douglas Freeman High School who did not want to see him 23 leave their school: and

24 WHEREAS, Richard Anthony worked for two years with vocational-education students who designed 25 and built houses to sell, the first program of its kind in the Richmond area; with his industrial arts and 26 administrative background, he was instrumental in finding land and orchestrating the details of the 27 program; and

28 WHEREAS, an accomplished woodworker, Richard Anthony enjoyed working on different projects 29 and built several additions to his own home; he also enjoyed traveling with his wife to World War II 30 battlefields; and

31 WHEREAS, Richard Anthony will be fondly remembered for his kind and generous nature and will 32 be greatly missed by his loving wife of 53 years, Jane; their children Dick, Fred, and David and their 33 families; and many friends and admirers; now, therefore, be it 34

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly mourn 35 the passing of a fine educator and outstanding Virginian, Richard Bryant Anthony, Sr.; and, be it RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution
