4	Establishing a joint subcommittee to study the benefits to the Commonwealth of appropriating additional
5 6	funds for cancer research. Report.

10	WHEREAS, cancer is the second leading cause of death in the United States; and
11 12	WHEREAS, men have a one in two chance of developing cancer in their lifetimes, and women have
12	a one in three chance; and WHEREAS, research advances in the last decade have provided new methods of detecting, treating
14	and preventing cancer, greatly increasing survival rates for many types of cancer; and
15	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth is home to two National Cancer Institute designated cancer research
16	centers, Virginia Commonwealth University's Massey Cancer Center and the University of Virginia
17	Cancer Center; and
18 19	WHEREAS, both the Massey Cancer Center and the University of Virginia Cancer Center rely on
19 20	federal, state, and private funds to finance their fight against cancer; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That a joint subcommittee be
21	established to study the benefits to the Commonwealth of appropriating additional funds for cancer
22	research. The joint subcommittee shall have a total membership of 13 members that shall consist of
23	eight legislative members, four nonlegislative citizen members, and one ex officio member. Members
24	shall be appointed as follows: three members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on
25	Rules; five members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
26 27	Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; one nonlegislative citizen member who shall be a representative of the Massey
28	Cancer Center to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; and three nonlegislative citizen
29	members one of whom shall be a representative of the University of Virginia Cancer Center, one of
30	whom shall be a licensed oncologist, and one of whom shall be a cancer survivor to be appointed by the
31	Speaker of the House of Delegates. The Secretary of Health and Human Services or her designee shall
32	serve ex officio with voting privileges. Nonlegislative citizen members of the joint subcommittee shall
33 34	be citizens of the Commonwealth of Virginia. Unless otherwise approved in writing by the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective clerk, nonlegislative citizen members shall only be reimbursed
35	for travel originating and ending within the Commonwealth of Virginia for the purpose of attending
36	meetings. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both
37	clerks shall be required. The joint subcommittee shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among
38	its membership, who shall be members of the General Assembly.
39 40	In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall (i) examine the sufficiency of current funding sources for both the Massey Cancer Center and the University of Virginia Cancer Center; (ii) review
40 41	history and successes of cancer research at each center; (iii) explore benefits to the Commonwealth of
42	expanding state support of both centers; and (iv) research additional funding opportunities for both
43	centers.
44	Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the Senate. Legal,
45 16	research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint subcommittee shall be provided by
46 47	the Division of Legislative Services. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the joint subcommittee for this study, upon request.
4 8	The joint subcommittee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2009 interim and four meetings for
49	the 2010 interim, and the direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$8,800 for each year without
50	approval as set out in this resolution. Approval for unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require
51	the written authorization of the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk. If a
52 53	companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall
55 54	be required. No recommendation of the joint subcommittee shall be adopted if a majority of the Senate members
55	or a majority of the House members appointed to the joint subcommittee (i) vote against the
56	recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the

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joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2009, and for

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the second year by November 30, 2010, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative 59 Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first 60 61 day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive summary shall 62 state whether the joint subcommittee intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a 63 report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The 64 executive summaries and reports shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be 65 posted on the General Assembly's website. 66

67 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
68 Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or
69 delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2009 and 2010
70 interims.

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
